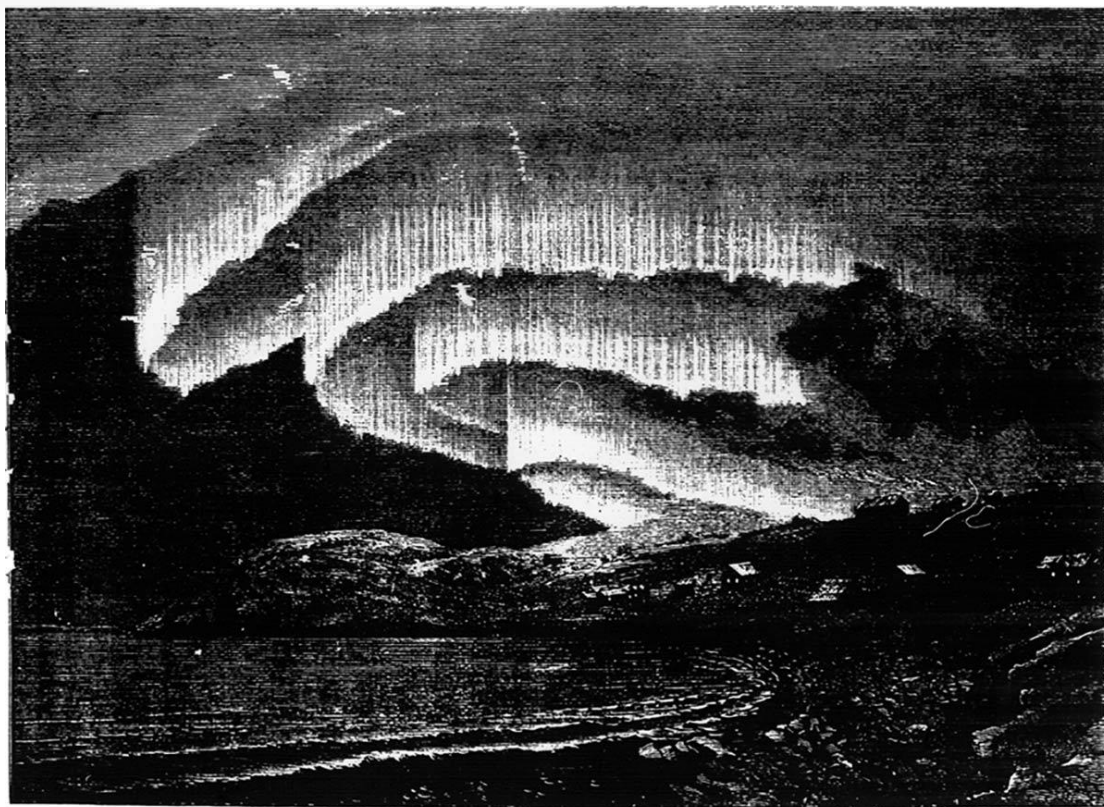
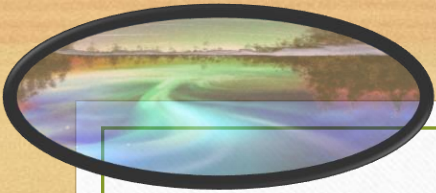
Northern lights

First picture took on northern lights

- German physicist and astronomer otto ,Rudolf Martin [1862 to 1938] took the first photo of northern lights . On January 5th 1892 the photo wich was black and white published in the centry magazine which gave people a glims of what they looked like .

What month is the best to see northern lights

- You can see northern lights November to February . You see them 9pm to 2pm on a clear day and night . The best sighting is between 11pm to midnight . You may also see them in summer month's [June and July] they are sometime's out in day but we cant see them like stars.



Why are they so special ?

- The aurora borealis [northern lights] is a vivid demonstration of the Earth's atmosphere . They do not look very high but are 80 to 120 km but can be higher
