**From Stoneage to Iron Age/
Global Trade**

In Literacy we will be writing stories linked to our novel *Boy in the tower* looking at setting descriptions and character descriptions.

We will be writing news paper reports, We will also be writing some persuasive pieces persuading people to do something we want.

We will also be writing our paragraphs about ourselves for the year book.

In Geography we will look at how:

Countries can export goods to another country to generate money and they can also **import** goods that may not be available to their own country.

Trade has been happening around the world for hundreds of years and **goods** are carried around the world by container ships and planes.

More than half of the world's **trade** takes place between the **G8**: Canada, Germany, France, Italy, Japan, Russia, UK and USA.

Not all trade is fair but **Fair trade** is there to help the producer receive a guaranteed fair price for whatever

In History we will:

Know that the Stone Age came before the Bronze Age and is the earliest known human culture.

Look at how the Stone Age left prehistoric sites on our landscape that are still visited today i.e. Stonehenge

See how Stone Age began with hunter gatherers who moved from site to site finding food using stone tools.

then move on to look at the copper uses for the bronze age before studying the advances as Britain moved into the Iron Age

In PD we will be learning about:

- habits (drug, alcohol and education).
- some of the risk and effect of legal and illegal substances.
- how to keep safe when using a mobile phone.
- how to support someone with a minor serious head injury, having a seizure, severe bleed.
- how to support someone with a minor burn or scald, having a heart attack or with a fractured bone.
- human reproduction, how a baby is made and grows, role and responsibilities of parents and that pregnancy can be prevented (recap from Y5).
- Recap changing in puberty from Y4.

Whilst covering the National Curriculum for Maths, we will use our Mathematical and problem solving skills when looking at data and statistics related to our topic. Following Sats we will look at real life problems while recapping the study we have done this year

From Stone Age to Iron Age/ Global Trade

In Science we will have the chance to explore how to change the brightness of a bulb in a circuit, how different wires affect a circuit, circuit symbols and lots more.

We will also study the heart and look at how it works

In RE we will be continuing our unit of Sikhism looking at the Rites of passage including the naming ceremonies and looking the 5 pillars of Islam.

In Art we will look at how humans and artists express themselves and create some art work of our own using an expressive style.
