Use conjunctions such as : “**et**” – “and” “**aussi**” – also” to extend your sentences.

Grammar

The phrase “**on peut**” translates to “**you can**” in English. When using “**on peut**”, it must be followed by a verb in its infinitive form. For example: **on peut avoir** (you can have), **on peut faire** (you can do), **on peut manger** (you can eat) etc.

Phonics

“**ette**” (casque**ette**, servie**tte**, raque**ttes**)

“**qu**” (casque**tte**, raque**ttes**)

“**er**” (nage**r**, joue**r**, saute**r**)

Final silent consonant: on pe**ut**, dan**s**, tongue**s**, maill**ot**, vien**s**, châteaux**,** raquette**s**, vague**s**, cha**ud**
