Dear Parents and Carers,

This week we have enjoyed learning about the end of World War II and the VE Day Celebrations in assemblies. We have listened to songs by Vera Lynn and seen images of the Royal Family taking part in the celebrations 80 year ago. The children were respectful and took part in the National Silence at 12 noon on Thursday and a visitor to school commended them on their behaviour and conduct. The children had an extra playtime to mark the occasion and a special VE Day themed lunch. Thank you for making such an effort to dress your child(ren) in red, white and blue for celebrations.



### Leave of Absences

Penalty Notices are requested from schools and **issued by the Local Authority** to the parents/carers of statutory school age children, and can be issued per parent, per child. For example: 3 siblings absent for leave of absence in term time could result in **each** parent/ carer receiving 3 separate fines at the below rates.

- **First offence** - The first time a Penalty Notice is issued the amount will be: £80 per parent, per child paid within 21 days. This fine increases to £160 per parent, per child if paid after day 21, until day 28.
- **Second Offence (within 3 years)** - the second time a Penalty Notice is issued the amount will be £160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days.
- **Third Offence and Any Further Offences (within 3 years)** - the third time an offence is committed a Penalty Notice will not be issued, and the case may be presented straight to the Magistrates' Court under s.444 of the Education Act (1996) or other legal

interventions considered. The Magistrates' Court can order fines up to £2500 per parent, per child.


**Failure to pay a Penalty Notice will render you liable to criminal proceedings in the Magistrates Court under Section 444 of the Education Act 1996.**





## Nursery

This week in Nursery, we have been reading the story of 'Little Red Riding Hood'. We have compared different parts of the story and talked about the characters. In Maths, we have been looking at sharing and discussing real life Maths problems.

Next week, we will be reading the story of 'The Little Red Hen'. We will be exploring what happens when we add dry objects to wet object in the Sand Area and the Playdough Area. In Maths, we will be exploring quantities and using quantity language to describe amounts.

## Reception

We have been reading "The Three Little Pigs" this week, as part of our topic on traditional tales. We have re told the story in our own words and have sequenced the main events in the correct order. We have been discussing the main characters and have used lots of super describing

words when talking to our partners in whole class work. We have used our own pictures and writing to re-tell the main events.

In our Mathematics we have been revising number bonds to 7. We have used quick recall when identifying the pairs of numbers that make 7. We have written our own number sentences when recording our work. We have also been reading and recognising numbers to 20 and beyond. We have been identifying 1 more or 1 less than a given number by jumping forwards or backwards along a number line.


We have been looking at minibeast patterns this week. We have been talking about the symmetrical patterns that we have observed and have created our own.

Next week in our Mathematics we will be using Tens Frames to help us count bigger numbers. We will also be adding and subtracting different amounts. We will be focussing on "Goldilocks" and will be reading "Hairy Maclary from Donaldson's Dairy" by Lynley Dodd.

## Year 1

A busy week in Year One spent practising skip counting. We counted in our 2s, 5s and 10s. The children have been grouping objects and skip counting them to work out the total. We brought our skip counting to life by planning a party and checking if we had enough food and drinks for the whole class.

In our writing this week, we practised spelling days of the week and revisited our letter formation. We have remembered that our days of the week start with a capital letter and enjoyed the days of the weeks songs to help us.

It was great to learn about VE Day across the week. We had our assembly at the start of the week, made some bunting for our classroom and had our red, white and blue day on Thursday, followed by an exciting VE Day lunch. The children were really interested in learning about the past and the impact it had on the way we live our lives today.

## Year 2

This week we have drafted up our character descriptions and started to edit them ready for our big write next week! We have continued learning about Florence Nightingale and took part in a 2 minutes silence for VE day!

## Year 3

In English we are continuing to learn about natural disasters and we have focused on earthquakes this week. We have found out how they are caused and about the effect they can have on our environment. We have practised using technical vocabulary linked to this topic.

In maths, we have consolidated our knowledge of column addition. We have learned how to estimate answers and solve problems involving this method.

In art we have focused on cross contouring and how this clever technique can make simple drawings look more realistic. We thought carefully about whether to use curved or straight lines in our work.

In geography we have discussed volcanoes and where in the world they are located and in R.E. we focused on Hanukkah and how this is celebrated by Jewish people.

In French we have been learning our numbers to 20 and we have practised asking how old people are and in Personal Development we have made posters encouraging people to wash their hands regularly.

In P.E. children have continued to practise their cricket skills. Please ensure that P.E. kits are brought in every Thursday and that jewellery has been removed at home before the lesson.

## Year 4

In English, we looked at instructions and spent time creating instructions for mummification based on facts from The Story of Tutankhamun. After that, we continued reading 'Humans' and practiced our retrieval skills. We worked in groups to identify key vocabulary in the story and create our own glossaries. Next week, we will be planning and writing character descriptions.

In Maths, we have used different representations for mixed whole number fractions and continued preparing for our MTC. Next week, we will be composing mixed number fractions to solve a range of problems.

In Geography, we investigated rivers around the UK and started reviewing our knowledge of the water cycle. In French, we continued our new unit on not feeling well and practised a doctor/patient script.

## Year 5

This week in English, we planned our short science-fiction narratives based on the bare bones of "Robot Girl". We shared our plans with partners and edited them to ensure that we had included all of the key details. Next, we wrote the opening to our stories and tried to include relative clauses and dialogue. We will continue to write these over the next few weeks.

In Maths, we divided a three-digit number by a single-digit number using the short division method with exchanging and remainders. We then applied this knowledge to problem solving

and finding the missing numbers in division calculations. Next week, we will explore more problems and use efficient strategies.

In Computing, we continued our work on creating media video. We looked at what a video is and evaluated one which had been created based on retro toys. We learnt about the different filming techniques and, using iPads, we worked with partners to try some of them out. Next, we used a storyboard to begin planning our own videos.

## Year 6

This week we have been looking at revising areas of maths and spag looking at multi step problems, fractions, volume and primes and squares in maths and word classes in SPAG. We have created posters to try and help us memorise all the terms over the weekend. We have also looked at the results of smoking in PD with Mrs Dean and played rounders and cricket with Miss Goulding in PE.

This weekend, spend 10 - 15 minutes revising the key topics and then get out and enjoy the weekend in the sun playing and being children.

Have a fantastic chilled weekend and we will see you at 8.00am Monday for a sausage sandwich.
