Dear parent / carer,

This week we need to make you aware of changes to school meals and our new management information system which will record contact details, registers and payments. It will also be used for messaging and meal ordering.

Please read the information carefully and set up your account.

School Meals Changes

Work is now well underway to ensure our kitchen staff and new caterer, Chartwells, are ready to introduce our new school meals service when we come back to school after the Easter holidays. As well as a new 3 weekly menu offering daily hot meal choices and jacket potatoes, we will also be introducing a daily panini cheese melt selection. We will share these menus with you in the next few days so that you can see what is to come.

This week we have contacted parents of pupils with a food allergy, intolerance or other dietary requirement. Chartwells require a completed **Diet Request Form** in order to be able to provide an appropriate menu. More details and a copy of the form were emailed to parents on Monday and completed forms must be returned to school as soon as possible. If you have any questions regarding this process please speak to office staff.

School System Changes

A few weeks ago we told you that we were moving to a new management information system (Arbor) which would lead to some changes for parents too. We are now live on Arbor and staff are getting to grips with all the changes! We are currently working on moving our school messaging, meal ordering and payment systems onto Arbor, this will also go live after the Easter holidays. In the week up to the holidays, we will have to switch off our existing Schoolcomms/Gateway app systems so that we can ensure everything is migrated in time and we need to ensure that ALL parents set-up their new Arbor accounts. An email with more details about what to do will be sent out shortly – please look out for this and set your new account up as quickly as possible.

Finally a brief reminder about Red Nose Day on Friday 20th March and Parents Evening on Wednesday 25th March.

Red noses are still available and if you haven't returned your Parents Evening slip yet please do so as a matter of urgency.

Attendance

Lates

Polite reminder that if your child/ren arrive between 8.55am and 9.15am they will receive a late mark (L) code. If your child/ren arrive after 9.15am they will receive a (U) code which is also an unauthorised late mark and could lead to a fixed penalty. Absences, whether authorised or unauthorised will bring your child/ren's attendance down.

Illnesses

It can be tricky deciding whether or not to keep your child off school, nursery or playgroup when they're unwell. Please see illnesses information below.

Polite reminder that if your child/ren are unwell, please ensure contact is made to the office, via the app or leaving a voicemail on 01226 711488. Please ensure a reason for absence is provided daily.

Appointments in school time

Polite reminder that medical/dental appointments need to be arranged outside of school hours, on occasions this may be unavoidable, please always ensure appointment confirmation cards/letters are provided to the school office at the earliest opportunity so these can be added to your child/ren's record.

Home visits

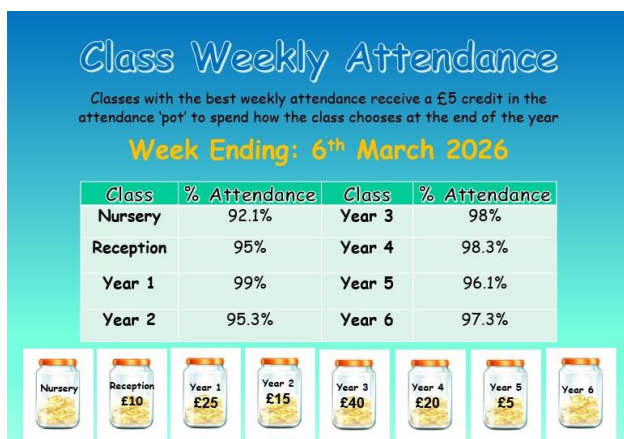
Home visits will be carried out to check on the well-being of children who are absent from school. These visits will take place in cases where no contact can be made to establish reason for absence and on day 3 of absence in all cases, and will continue if absence persists. In some cases, dependent on the circumstances surrounding pupil absence, we may make a home visit sooner. If deemed appropriate, the Education Welfare Officer may make the home visit.

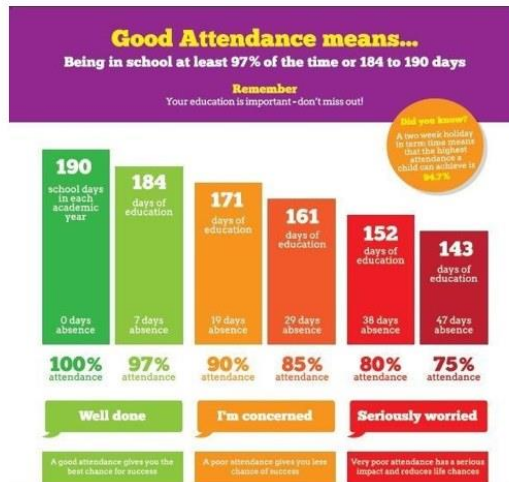
Leave of Absences

Penalty Notices are requested from schools and **issued by the Local Authority** to the parents/carers of statutory school age children, and can be issued per parent, per child. For example: 3 siblings absent for leave of absence in term time could result in **each** parent/ carer receiving 3 separate fines at the below rates.

- **First offence** - The first time a Penalty Notice is issued the amount will be: £80 per parent, per child paid within 21 days. This fine increases to £160 per parent, per child if paid after day 21, until day 28.
- **Second Offence (within 3 years)** - the second time a Penalty Notice is issued the amount will be £160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days.
- **Third Offence and Any Further Offences (within 3 years)** - the third time an offence is committed a Penalty Notice will not be issued, and the case may be presented straight to the Magistrates’ Court under s.444 of the Education Act (1996) or other legal interventions considered. The Magistrates’ Court can order fines up to £2500 per parent, per child.

Failure to pay a Penalty Notice will render you liable to criminal proceedings in the Magistrates Court under Section 444 of the Education Act 1996.


This year, red noses will be on sale from Wednesday 4th March during break times and are priced at £2.00.



Nursery

This week in Nursery, we have been describing the monsters we have seen in our books. We have been using positional language to describe where objects and people are.

Next week, we will be reading the story of 'The Colour Monster' and 'Little Bear's Spring'. We will be discussing our different emotions and what happens in Spring. In Maths, we will be exploring repeating patterns.

Reception

This week in reception class we have continued to learn about Monsters and have read more stories about monsters including The Great Monster Hunt and Monsters in Underpants, to compare the different types of monsters. We have used the monsters in our stories as inspiration to design our own monster, ready to talk about it with our friends.

In literacy we have continued to learn about Morris the Mankiest monster and have practised using 'I can see' sentences to help us with our writing.

In our number learning, we have been learning about the number seven and exploring the different ways to make number seven using two parts to make a whole. The children have been using different coloured cubes to do this and are able to explain lots of ways to make 7.

Next week, we will start to learn about Spring and will be planting seeds and talking about how plants grow.

Year 1

A fantastic week of learning in Year 1.

We completed our David Attenborough learning and started to explore mark making in Art. We have drawn different lines such as curvy, wavy and straight.

In Maths we learned that a unit of measure can be in centimetres and had fun gathering objects from around the classroom to measure and record our results.

In English we have been reading "Sonya's Chickens" and learned all about the character Sonya using lots of talk about her kind nature.

We have been talking a lot about resilience and independence in assemblies and in class. The children are becoming much more confident in tackling new learning and having a go! Well done everyone.

In Personal Development lessons, we have been talking about how families are different and who is important to the children.

Year 2

Year 2 have had another busy and enjoyable week of learning. The children continue to show fantastic effort in their lessons and are becoming increasingly confident in applying the skills they have been developing.

In Reading, we have been completing a contrasting fact file about the UK so that we can compare it with India. The children used the information they have learned to identify similarities and differences between the two countries and organised their facts clearly.

In Writing, we have been reading the book "*The Disgusting Sandwich*" and thinking about our own disgusting sandwiches that we might like to create. We focused on using noun phrases, such as *disgusting sandwich* (adjective + noun), while also remembering to use capital letters and full stops correctly in our sentences.

In Maths, we have been exploring pictograms and bar charts. The children have been using the information they collected to find the difference between amounts, allowing them to apply many of the maths skills they have learned in a more challenging way.

In Art, we practised drawing a nose in detail by starting with a base structure, adding features and then shading to bring the drawing to life. Next, we will begin practising the mouth.

In Science, we explored food chains and completed our end-of-topic assessment, showing that we have retained some excellent knowledge. In PE, we combined our passing, pivoting, shooting and defending skills in mini matches, and our confidence is really growing.

Next week in Maths, we will finish our topic by solving word problems to demonstrate the skills we have learned. In Art, we will explore where facial features should be placed to ensure symmetry. We will also use our habitat knowledge from Science to investigate where different animals live around the world and why.

Year 3

This week in literacy, we have been reading 'Cloud Tea Monkeys' and we have practised using speech in our writing, as well as a range of sentence types.

In maths, we have learned how to subtract by partitioning numbers and also by finding the difference.

We have enjoyed celebrating World Book Day this week and we have participated in a variety of exciting activities in school including signing up for a story and inventing our very own book characters!

In history this week, we have learned about the davy lamp and why it was invented, as well as other changes that were put in place by the government after The Oaks Mining Disaster to keep miners safe.

We made Mother's Day cards in art and we have used Scratch to help us with our computing unit of work on programming. We also identified and discussed the different feelings we experience in P.D.

In science, we learned about George Washington Carver and how he changed farming by using crop rotation. In P.E. we continued with football and athletics. Please ensure children have their P.E. kits in school **every Thursday and Friday, including outdoor trainers**. As the weather is improving, we will try to get outside when we can but if children do not have sensible footwear then they will be unable to participate in our lessons due to safety concerns.

In R.E. we have continued to study the Easter story, discussing and answering questions about the key parts of the story and in music we have continued to practise our class song.

Year 4

This week in year 4 we have been using noun phrases and diaries in English and next week we will continue learning skills to put in an independent diary. We have been attempting to use the key words from our whole class read lessons in our sentences to improve our vocabulary.

In maths we have been multiplying and dividing by ten by adding and removing place holders and we will continue this next week. We have also completed an arithmetic assessment, any gaps in learning will be addressed in our maths starter - 5 in 5.

We have been showing some enthusiasm in swimming, naming body parts in French and learning how we hear in science. We have studied at the eight fold path and the four noble truths in RE.

Year 5

In English, we continued our unit on science-fiction by identifying how an author shows character's feelings through actions; focusing on the importance of 'show not tell'. Next, we described a setting by combining ordinary details with a strange or futuristic element and used similes or metaphors to create clear and vivid images. Next week, we will create tension by varying sentence length and use dialogue to show character thoughts and feelings.

In Maths, we multiplied two-digit numbers by single-digit numbers using both expanded and short multiplication, including two regroupings. We used Braining Camp to work out the calculations practically, using the Base 10 resources.

In Geography, we began a new topic on coasts. We started by exploring coastal areas around the UK and then Europe. After that, we looked at photographs of different coastal areas and sorted them into two columns- erosional features and depositional features. Next week, we will find out about the physical features of coasts and the processes of erosion that affect them.

Year 6

Year 6 have had another busy and productive week filled with writing, problem-solving and exciting investigations across the curriculum.

In English, the children have been developing their journalistic writing skills. They began by exploring how to structure a balanced newspaper report and took part in a shared write based on events from "Pig Heart Boy". The children then planned and wrote their own journalistic articles, before editing and improving their work at the end of the week. Many pupils showed excellent understanding of how tone, structure and quotations are used in newspaper writing.

In Maths, we have continued our work on fractions. The children compared and ordered non-related fractions using different strategies, including using their understanding of one half. Later in the week, they progressed to multiplying fractions, building confidence with both unit and non-unit fractions.

In Science, we continued learning about the human body, focusing on how nutrients and water are transported around the body and why a healthy diet and regular exercise are important. The children also planned a scientific enquiry to investigate how exercise affects the heart.

We also enjoyed lessons in Music, French, Computing, and PE. In Computing, the children used technology to turn their newspaper reports into realistic news articles, which they really enjoyed seeing come to life.

To finish the week, the class created Mother's Day cards, putting lots of care and creativity into their designs.

It has been another fantastic week of learning — well done, Year 6!

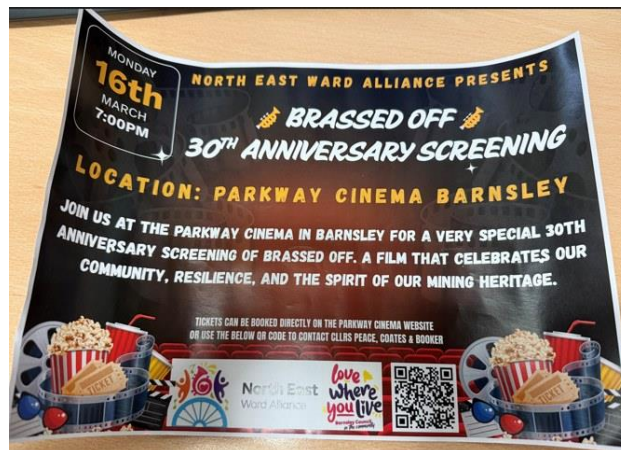
