Attendance

Our attendance target is 96%. Each week the class with the highest attendance receives an award and £5 credit towards an end of year treat. Last week, **Y3** achieved the highest attendance of 98.6%. **WELL DONE!**

Lates

Polite reminder that if your child/ren arrive between 8.55am and 9.15am they will receive a late mark (L) code. If your child/ren arrive after 9.15am they will receive a (U) code which is also an unauthorised late mark and could lead to a fixed penalty. Absences, whether authorised or unauthorised will bring your child/ren's attendance down.

Illnesses

It can be tricky deciding whether or not to keep your child off school, nursery or playgroup when they're unwell. Please see illnesses information below.

Polite reminder that if your child/ren are unwell, please ensure contact is made to the office, via the app or leaving a voicemail on 01226 711488. Please ensure a reason for absence is provided daily.

Appointments in school time

Polite reminder that medical/dental appointments need to be arranged outside of school hours, on occasions this may be unavoidable, please always ensure appointment confirmation cards/letters are provided to the school office at the earliest opportunity so these can be added to your child/ren's record.

Home visits

Home visits will be carried out to check on the well-being of children who are absent from school. These visits will take place in cases where no contact can be made to establish reason for absence and on day 3 of absence in all cases, and will continue if absence persists. In some cases, dependent on the circumstances surrounding pupil absence, we may make a home visit sooner. If deemed appropriate, the Education Welfare Officer may make the home visit.

Leave of Absences

Penalty Notices are requested from schools and **issued by the Local Authority** to the parents/carers of statutory school age children, and can be issued per parent, per child. For example: 3 siblings absent for leave of absence in term time could result in **each** parent/ carer receiving 3 separate fines at the below rates.

- **First offence** - The first time a Penalty Notice is issued the amount will be: £80 per parent, per child paid within 21 days. This fine increases to £160 per parent, per child if paid after day 21, until day 28.
- **Second Offence (within 3 years)** - the second time a Penalty Notice is issued the amount will be £160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days.
- **Third Offence and Any Further Offences (within 3 years)** - the third time an offence is committed a Penalty Notice will not be issued, and the case may be presented straight to the Magistrates' Court under s.444 of the Education Act (1996) or other legal interventions considered. The Magistrates' Court can order fines up to £2500 per parent, per child.

Failure to pay a Penalty Notice will render you liable to criminal proceedings in the Magistrates Court under Section 444 of the Education Act 1996.

Reception

We have had a busy week in reception class.

In literacy we have read the story, "The Tiny Seed" and made predictions about what we thought would happen at different points in the story and talked about the events of the story. Next week we will write simple instructions on how to plant a seed.

In our number learning, we have been learning how to double numbers. We learnt that the two parts have to be equal to make a whole when doubling and have tried to use this vocabulary in our learning.

In our wider curriculum learning we have been learning about the season Spring and have looked at the changes we notice. We have learnt about plants and flowers that grow in the Spring and baby animals that are born. Next week we will be learning about the Easter story.

Year 1

A lovely week in Year One. We really enjoyed finishing our puppets in DT this week, it was lovely to see the finished product that they had been doing with Mrs Heeley!

In Maths, we have been solving problems using rulers to measure in cm. The children have been learning that we need to measure accurately using the correct starting place with our ruler.

In English, we have been spelling days of the week by writing recounts of Sonya's day from our book 'Sonya's chickens' we have also been making sure that we use capital letters for names and the personal pronoun 'I'

We finished our Art topic 'mark making' by making rubbings using different materials and went outside to find natural items to make rubbings from.

Year 2

Year 2 have had a thoughtful and productive week of learning, and we are very proud of the maturity and kindness the children have shown throughout.

In Reading, we explored a sensitive story about Ruby and her Nanna, who sadly passed away. The children approached this topic with great care, showing empathy and respect during discussions. They also continued to practise key comprehension skills, demonstrating thoughtful understanding of the text.

In Writing, we have completed our own instructions on how to make a disgusting sandwich! From stinky giraffe poo to slimy slugs and wriggly spiders, the children showed fantastic creativity. They confidently used conjunctions, bossy verbs and noun phrases, and we are all incredibly proud of the effort and progress they have made.

In Maths, we have mastered using bar models to find the missing part and can now apply this skill confidently to a range of word problems.

In Geography, we learned about animals around the world and the continents they live in. In RE, we explored what a parable is and how Jesus used stories to share important messages in his teachings.

Next week, in Writing we will begin a new story, "*Bear Under the Stairs*". In Maths, we will use our statistics skills to create and interpret our own pictograms. In Art, we will continue developing our portraits of Florence Nightingale, and in DT we will be making our own sandwiches.

Year 3

This week in literacy, we have been writing our own setting descriptions of a rice plantation and we have tried our best to include all of the skills we have been taught over the last couple of weeks.

In maths, we have practised how to subtract numbers using partitioning strategies as well as trying to find the difference between numbers. We have thought carefully about which strategy is the most efficient to use.

In PD this week, we have learned about what it takes to be a good friend and in French we have learned our numbers to 16.

In P.E. we continued with football and athletics. Please ensure children have their P.E. kits in school **every Thursday and Friday, including outdoor trainers**. As the weather is improving, we

will try to get outside when we can but if children do not have sensible footwear then they will be unable to participate in our lessons.

In R.E. we have continued to study the Easter story, discussing and answering questions about the key parts of the story and in music we have continued to practise our class song- Dragon.

We have also started to sew our cushions this week, using the cross stitch and running stitch techniques that we have been practising.

Year 4

This week in year 4, we have been studying diaries in English and next week we will be writing an independent one from the point of view of one of the characters.

In maths we have been multiplying and dividing by 10 and 100 using place value charts and gattegno charts.

In the wider curriculum we have explored shading using techniques and making different tones in art.

In PE we practiced using the side of our feet to pass a football. We have also been getting more confident in swimming with lots of children having their armbands removed.

We have been moving our bodies in yoga poses. In RE we have continued to study our unit of Buddhists looking at Karma and reincarnation.

1 - Swimming for Y4 children starts on Monday 2nd March 2026, timetable is attached. Please ensure your child/ren bring their swimming bag, costume and towel every Monday.

Year 5

In English, we learnt how to create tension by varying sentence length and used dialogue, with detailed reporting clauses, to show character thoughts and feelings. After that, we explored how an author reveals a discovery and wrote a discovery moment which was clear and dramatic. Next week, we will plan and write our own short science fiction narrative, using the key features covered in this unit.

In Maths, we continued our unit on multiplication and moved on to multiplying three-digit numbers by single-digit numbers, using both expanded and short multiplication. We used Braining Camp to work out the calculations practically, using the Base 10 resources.

In Geography, we identified the human and physical features of coastal areas and labelled a sketch map to show these in a typical coastal town. Next, we found out that coastal areas are constantly changing by the processes of erosion, transportation and deposition and began to look at a case study on the Holbeck Hall Hotel disaster in 1993.

Year 6

Year 6 have had another fantastic week of learning, showing great maturity, curiosity and engagement across all subjects.

In English, we began exploring balanced arguments, identifying key features and how writers present different viewpoints. The children gathered and organised information to support an argument and explored Cameron's thoughts and feelings to understand different perspectives. Towards the end of the week, they developed their writing further by learning how to use the passive voice to create a more formal and objective tone.

In Maths, we focused on fractions, learning how to divide both unit and non-unit fractions by whole numbers. The children then applied their understanding to solve problems efficiently. Later in the week, we moved on to shape, using knowledge of properties to sketch, identify and accurately draw shapes using rulers and protractors.

In Science, the children planned, carried out and evaluated their own investigation into the effects of exercise on the heart. They worked carefully to record results and wrote thoughtful conclusions, demonstrating a strong understanding of how exercise impacts the body.

We also enjoyed a range of wider curriculum lessons, including Music, French, Computing, and PE. In Computing, the children explored how to improve a game by using variables, developing their problem-solving and coding skills.

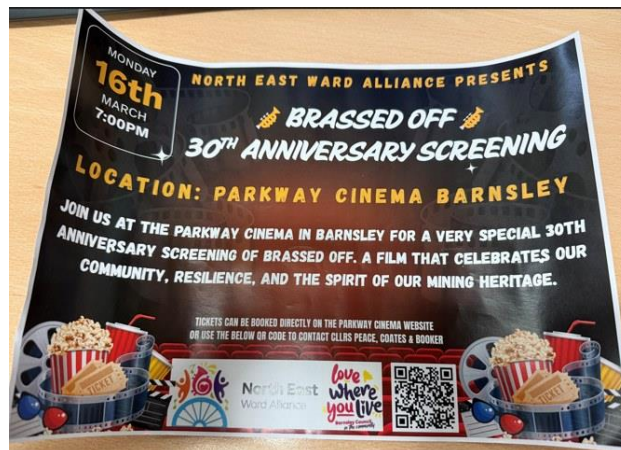
