Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope you have all been enjoying the beautiful weather. The children have had fun learning outdoors this week whenever the opportunity has arose. A quick reminder to parents/carers to label your child's uniform; this is particularly important when children are removing items of clothing in the warmer weather. Details of the summer uniform are available on the school website for your information. This week we have had children coming to school in shorts which is totally acceptable if their shorts are the correct length for school and the school colours. **Children will be given spare uniform to change into if they arrive at school in shorts that are inappropriate for school.**

Please ensure that you support your child(ren) by helping them to practice their phonics, times tables, reading fluency, reading understanding, spellings, arithmetic and any other tasks sent home in order to help them reach their potential. If your child is in Y6 please get them to our final boosters sessions, it could make a big difference to their final outcomes.

Year 1 parents please make every attempt to attend the Phonic Screening Parents Meeting which takes place on Friday 16th May at 9am. Information about the PSC will be shared along with how you can support your child(ren).

All parents/carers please take note of the next INSET which is Friday 23.05.25. School will be closed to all children on this day.

This weekend is a bank holiday weekend; enjoy the 3 day weekend and we will see you all on Tuesday 6th May.

## Attendance

Our attendance target is 96%. Each week the class with the highest attendance receives an award and £5 credit towards an end of year treat. On the last week of term, **Nursery** achieved the highest attendance of 98.6%. **WELL DONE!**

### Lates

Polite reminder that if your child/ren arrive between 8.55am and 9.15am they will receive a late mark (L) code. If your child/ren arrive after 9.15am they will receive a (U) code which is also an unauthorised late mark. Absences, whether authorised or unauthorised will bring your child/ren's attendance down.

### Illnesses

It can be tricky deciding whether or not to keep your child off school, nursery or playgroup when they're unwell. Please see illnesses information below.

Polite reminder that if your child/ren are unwell, please ensure contact is made to the office, via the app or leaving a voicemail on 01226 711488. Please ensure a reason for absence is provided daily.

### Leave of Absences

Penalty Notices are requested from schools and **issued by the Local Authority** to the parents/carers of statutory school age children, and can be issued per parent, per child. For example: 3 siblings absent for leave of absence in term time could result in **each** parent/ carer receiving 3 separate fines at the below rates.

- **First offence** - The first time a Penalty Notice is issued the amount will be: £80 per parent, per child paid within 21 days. This fine increases to £160 per parent, per child if paid after day 21, until day 28.
- **Second Offence (within 3 years)** - the second time a Penalty Notice is issued the amount will be £160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days.
- **Third Offence and Any Further Offences (within 3 years)** - the third time an offence is committed a Penalty Notice will not be issued, and the case may be presented straight to the Magistrates' Court under s.444 of the Education Act (1996) or other legal interventions considered. The Magistrates' Court can order fines up to £2500 per parent, per child.

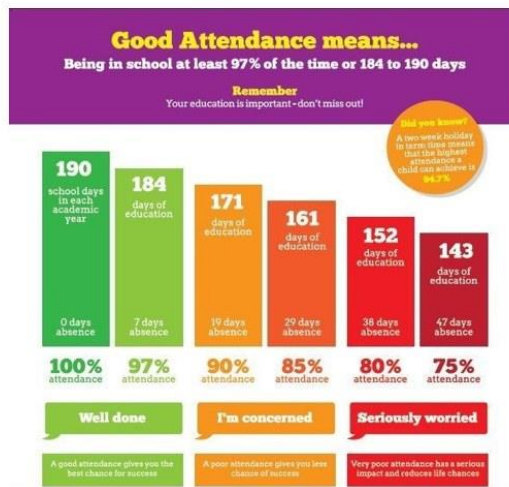
**Failure to pay a Penalty Notice will render you liable to criminal proceedings in the Magistrates Court under Section 444 of the Education Act 1996.**

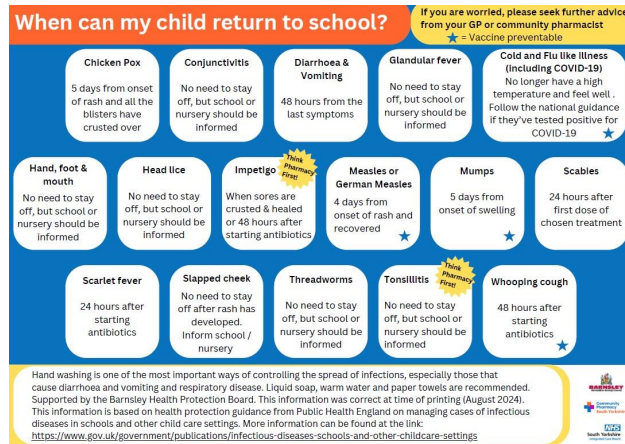



## Nursery

This week in Nursery, we have been reading the story of 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears'. We have compared different versions of the story and discussed what happens to the characters. In Maths, we have been practising our careful counting.

Next week, we will be reading the story of 'Little Red Riding Hood', where we will be talking about the characters and what happens in the story. In Maths, we will be exploring sharing and halving items. In our Curriculum lessons, we will be exploring changes over time by looking at items such as fruit and plants.

## Reception

We have continued to find out lots of minibeasts facts this week. We have used lots of non-fiction books to help us find out information and have enjoyed looking at the photographs. A big well done to the children who have carried out their own minibeasts hunts at home.

In our literacy sessions we have been reading "The Three Billy Goats Gruff". We have retold the story in our own words and have sequenced the key events. We are learning how to use expression when reading.

In our Mathematics we have been reading and recognising numbers at 20 and beyond. We have been learning the position of the numbers when using number lines. We have also been revising our number bonds to 6. I am really impressed with the vocabulary the children are using when talking about their work.

In our daily RWInc lesson we are learning lots of new sounds. We are learning how to use these sounds when spelling our own words.

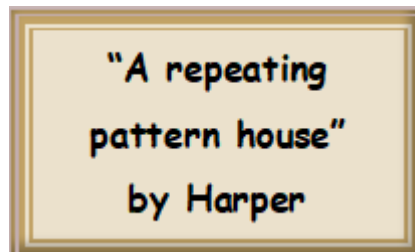
Well done Reception children, another fabulous week.

## Year 1

Year One have been busy learning to count in groups of two! The children practiced skip counting and began to recognise number patterns. They showed great enthusiasm and growing confidence with their counting skills!

In English, Year One explored the differences between hot and cold places around the world. They used descriptive language to talk about what they might see, feel, and hear in these environments, showing great curiosity and imagination!

Year One had an exciting time planting seeds this week as part of their science learning! The children learned what plants need to grow and carefully planted their own seeds in pots. ## Year 2

This week we have been collecting the features of a character description so that we can be well prepared for our big write next week!

We have smashed out 10 and 5 times tables and are now looking at the relatedness between the two! In DT we are almost ready to start building our amazing fire engines! Next week in History we will be continuing to study Florence Nightingale! We are really enjoying this topic. Maybe you could test our knowledge at home?

## Year 3

In English this week we have written a persuasive text about The Dell, explaining why people need to try the best to keep it clean and tidy for people to continue using. We have used vocabulary for effect, adverbials, prepositions and a range of sentence types to improve our writing.

In Whole Class reading, we have just started to read a non-fiction text called 'Earth Shattering Events.' We have focused on the blurb, contents page, index and introduction this week.

In maths, we have continued with column addition, making sure we are completely secure with carrying ones and tens to find the correct answers. We have started to solve some problems using this method too.

In science, we have started our topic on 'living Things' and we have learnt about what our bodies need for growth and energy. We re-capped what the different food types are and what the body needs for a healthy diet too.

In P.E., we continued to practise our cricket skills and we focused on how Jewish people celebrate the Passover festival in R.E.

In art, we focused on contouring and using the 'line' method to create realistic drawings of objects and in French we learned numbers to 20.

We also began our new geography topic on 'Natural Disasters' and we labelled the different layers of the earth.

## Year 4

In English we have been writing non-chronological reports linked to Ancient Egypt. In our reading sessions we have been exploring "The Humans" book, learning about the Nubians and Egyptians.

Year 4 children have been very creative in their Art lessons, creating recycled artwork and experimenting with joining different materials.

In Science we have been studying parts of the eye.

Year 4 children in their Personal Development sessions have been taking part in group discussions around how to respond in emergency situations.

Next week in Year 4 we will be continuing our non-chronological reports with a focus on self-editing and using a range of conjunctions. In our reading sessions we will delve deeper into "The Humans", focusing on the Egyptians and exploring more complex vocabulary and in our Maths we will be constructing wholes, comparing parts within a whole, and reviewing times tables knowledge.

We will continue developing our understanding across all other subjects covered this week, building on the knowledge and skills we've been practicing.

## Year 5

In English, we completed our balanced arguments and spent time editing them and sharing them with the class. After that, we finished reading 'Robot Girl' and used the bare bones of the story to plan and write our own short science-fiction narratives. We worked in groups to edit the bare bones planning of Malorie Blackman's version of Robot Girl and then began to plan our own version of the story. Next week, we will continue to plan and write our stories, ensuring that all of the key features of the genre are included.

In Maths, we have used different representations to divide 3-digit numbers by a single digit number. Some of us used Braining Camp on the iPads for support and some used informal methods of partitioning. Next week, we will use short division and efficient methods to solve problems.

In Art, we completed our montages by adding repeated figures to our backgrounds and adding detail where necessary. Some of our finished work will be displayed in the classroom. In computing, we started a new unit on creating media video. We will look at what a video is and how different filming techniques can be used to enhance videos.

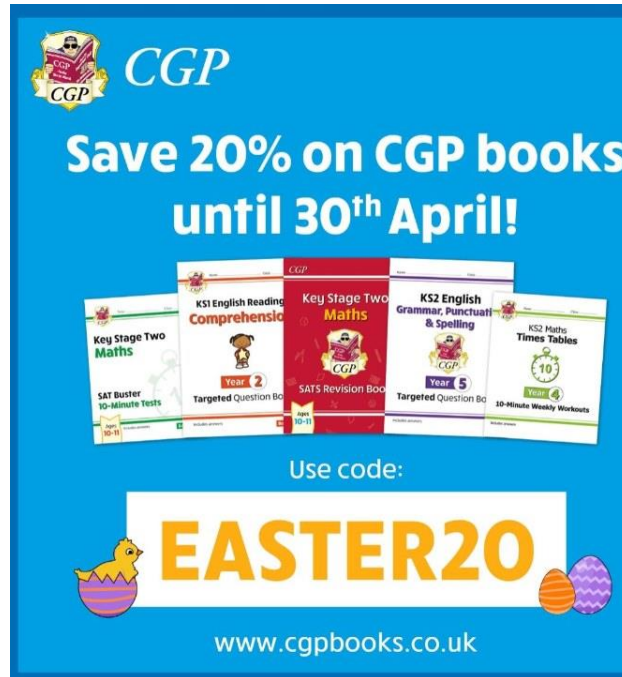
## Year 6

This week we have written news reports and letters in English and also completed some practise reading and GPS work. In maths this week we have looked at the mean average and order of operations. In morning tasks, we have looked at 2d shapes as well as methods for arithmetic.

In the afternoons, we have continued our revision practise and completed some excellent competitive PE lessons with Miss Goulding and we have looked at the effects of smoking with Mrs Dean in PD.
