Lates

If your child/ren arrive after 9.15am they will receive a (U) code which is also an unauthorised late mark. Absences, whether authorised or unauthorised will bring your child/ren's attendance down.

It can be tricky deciding whether or not to keep your child off school, nursery or playgroup when they're unwell. Please see illnesses information below.




Leave of Absences

Penalty Notices are requested from schools and **issued by the Local Authority** to the parents/carers of statutory school age children, and can be issued per parent, per child. For example: 3 siblings absent for leave of absence in term time could result in **each** parent/ carer receiving 3 separate fines at the below rates.

- **First offence** - The first time a Penalty Notice is issued the amount will be: £80 per parent, per child paid within 21 days. This fine increases to £160 per parent, per child if paid after day 21, until day 28.
- **Second Offence (within 3 years)** - the second time a Penalty Notice is issued the amount will be £160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days.
- **Third Offence and Any Further Offences (within 3 years)** - the third time an offence is committed a Penalty Notice will not be issued, and the case may be presented straight to the Magistrates' Court under s.444 of the Education Act (1996) or other legal interventions considered. The Magistrates' Court can order fines up to £2500 per parent, per child.

Failure to pay a Penalty Notice will render you liable to criminal proceedings in the Magistrates Court under Section 444 of the Education Act 1996.

In Maths, we have been exploring 3D Shapes.

Next week, we will be reading the story of 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears'. We will also be exploring what happens to dry materials when we add a liquid but exploring the Sand Area and making porridge.

Reception

Welcome to the Summer Term, it's lovely to see everyone back after the Easter holidays.

This week we have made a great start to our topic on minibeasts. We have used our outdoor area to spot any creatures that live here. We have spoken about the need to respect their habitats and have carefully placed back any stones that we have looked under. We have also used lots of non-fiction books to help us find out lots of interesting facts.

In our Mathematics we have been ordering, recognising and writing numbers to 20. We have used counting rhymes and songs to help us with this. We have been working hard to form our numbers correctly.

In our class discussions we have been talking about our own likes, hobbies and interests. We have spoken about how we are all individuals and like different things. We have spoken about our different strengths and talents. Please continue to send in photographs showing out of school interests and pursuits. It's always great to see what the children are interested in and out of school.



Year 1

Welcome back Year One!

We've had a lovely first week back. It sounds like all the children had lots of fun over Easter and enjoyed their chocolate!

In our plants topic for science this week, we've learned that plants are living things that grow in the ground. The children also discovered that plants have different parts, like roots, stems, leaves, and flowers. We will be finding out that plants need sunlight, water, and air to live and grow. Year One will also have the opportunity to plant a seed and watch it grow!

In Maths, we continued measurement. The children learned how to measure the length of objects using a ruler. We found out that a ruler helps us see how long or short something is by comparing the length of different colour pencils.

In English this week we started our new book – Yeti and the Bird. The Yeti lives all alone in the snowy mountains. He looks big and scary, so everyone stays away from him. But really, the Yeti is kind and gentle—just very lonely. One day, a little bird gets lost and meets the Yeti. They become friends, and the Yeti learns that it's nice to have someone to share things with. The story shows us that even the loneliest creatures can find friendship.

A huge well done to Year One for winning the attendance award this week, we are excited to see the money in our pot going up!

Year 2

What a wonderful first week back we have had. We have gotten straight back into our learning and started our new topic on Wolves. We are going to be writing a character description for our final piece, we are now moving on to the ten times table in maths and carrying on with our topic on Florence Nightingale, next week we are continuing with our work on fire engines and deciding what sized boxes will be the best to use.

Year 3

In English this week, we have practised using a range of conjunctions in our writing to form complex sentences. We have looked at a picture of The Dell and we have discussed what might happen if this area is not looked after. We had some fantastic ideas and we thought of some excellent vocabulary examples too.

In Whole Class reading, we have learned about countries in East Africa and how to summarise what we have read about them.

In maths, we have moved on to column addition, ensuring that we add our ones first, then our tens and hundreds. We also moved on to missing number problems in column addition to challenge ourselves.

In computing, we made branching databases and tested them and in PD we had a class discussion about putting ourselves in other people's shoes in certain situations.

In P.E., we began our unit on cricket and we focused on the Judaism religion in R.E. We also began practising our new class song in music this week too.

Swimming lessons will resume for Year 3 on Monday next week. Please send your child to school with their usual swimming kit as well as a long-sleeved top, long-sleeved bottoms and a plastic carrier bag. The children will be taking part in a water safety lesson. Please do not send any denim clothing or onesies.

Thank you to the children who have brought back their sewing homework. Please could you return this to school as soon as possible if you haven't already done so.

1 - Y3 parents - next week it is water safety week!

A long sleeve t-shirt and long bottoms along with their swimwear are required to their lesson next week along with a plastic bag for them to place their wet clothes in for the return to school.

Please note : No Onesies, no lined or denim clothing will be allowed as these will be too heavy for the children to swim.

Year 4

This week in English, Y4 students finished their stories based on Odd and The Frost Giant. In Reading, we've started looking at a text called The Humans and have been practicing using a dictionary to find essential scientific terms as well as answering key questions about specific sections of the text. In math's, they have been investigating fractions and examining wholes and parts in various contexts. In French, they reviewed parts of bodies and began introducing phrases to help them express how they are feeling when they are ill. As part of PD, they discussed which food types make up a balanced diet and how we can utilize nutrition labels to learn more about the food we eat. In DT, we learnt about Thomas Edison and Lewis Latimer along with their contributions to electrical developments. This is part of their continued torch project. In Music, we've been listening to Blackbird by the Beatles and practicing finding the pulse. We have also begun to learnt and practice parts of the song. In PE we have explored different authentic games as part of a circuit and worked on being team players.

Next week Y4 will begin to look at equal and unequal parts of various shapes and continue our reading of The Humans. They will also begin our new literacy unit based on The Story of Tutankhamun. Our spelling focus next week is words containing 'sol' and 'real'.

Year 5

We hope you all had a lovely Easter and enjoyed spending time with family.

We've had a great start to the summer term and the children have really impressed us with their hard work and enthusiasm this week.

In English, we went back to our class novel Robot Girl by Malorie Blackman and started to plan a balanced argument on whether the main character should destroy the AI robot. To gather opinions and ideas, both for and against, we took part in a drama activity called conscious alley. One child took on the role of the main character and walked between the rest of the class, while they gave their opinions. At the end, the child in character gave their overall opinion on whether the robot will be destroyed. Next week, we will plan and write the balanced arguments.

In Maths, we continued our work on division using short division with exchanging. We also applied our knowledge to problem solving by using our times tables to solve the missing numbers of arrays. We then used counters to find all of the arrays that could be made for 19, 20 and 21. Next week, we will continue looking at division with exchanging and remainders.

In Art, we continued our unit on 'People in Action' and completed the backgrounds for our montages. We used watercolour, pastels and shading. We then used our figures from the previous lesson to explore how movement could be created by repeating the placement of the figure.

Year 6

A fast-paced week in year 6 where we have been motoring full throttle through order of operations in maths and maths revision in afternoons practising question style problems. Next week we will look at the mean in lessons and continue problem solving.


