Lates

Polite reminder that if your child/ren arrive between 8.55am and 9.15am they will receive a late mark (L) code. If your child/ren arrive after 9.15am they will receive a (U) code which is also an unauthorised late mark. Absences, whether authorised or unauthorised will bring your child/ren's attendance down.

It can be tricky deciding whether or not to keep your child off school, nursery or playgroup when they're unwell. Please see illnesses information below.



Polite reminder that if your child/ren are unwell, please ensure contact is made to the office, via the app or leaving a voicemail on 01226 711488. Please ensure a reason for absence is provided daily.

Leave of Absences

Penalty Notices are requested from schools and **issued by the Local Authority** to the parents/carers of statutory school age children, and can be issued per parent, per child. For example: 3 siblings absent for leave of absence in term time could result in **each** parent/ carer receiving 3 separate fines at the below rates.

- **First offence** - The first time a Penalty Notice is issued the amount will be: £80 per parent, per child paid within 21 days. This fine increases to £160 per parent, per child if paid after day 21, until day 28.
- **Second Offence (within 3 years)** - the second time a Penalty Notice is issued the amount will be £160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days.
- **Third Offence and Any Further Offences (within 3 years)** - the third time an offence is committed a Penalty Notice will not be issued, and the case may be presented straight to the Magistrates' Court under s.444 of the Education Act (1996) or other legal interventions considered. The Magistrates' Court can order fines up to £2500 per parent, per child.

Failure to pay a Penalty Notice will render you liable to criminal proceedings in the Magistrates Court under Section 444 of the Education Act 1996.

School Lunches

Free School Meals

If your child's eligible, you could save up to £400 a year with free school meals. You qualify for free school meals if you receive:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Child Tax Credit with an annual income of less than £16,190, provided you aren't receiving Working Tax Credit
- The 'guaranteed' element of the State Pension Credit
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)
- Universal Credit with an annual net earned income threshold of less than £7400
- Support under part six of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999


We have had a fabulous spring term Reception children. An enormous well done to you all!

In English, we have practised using several of the Year 3 writing objectives in our own writing. We have written a diary extract in role as the old man from our tin Forest story and we have tried to include speech marks, compound and complex sentences, time adverbials, words for effect and paragraphs.

In maths, we have learned that we can use addition and subtraction equations to describe the same additive relationship and we have practised rearranging addition and subtraction equations but making sure they are still in the correct order.

We also performed our current class song in music and we had a practise on the glockenspiels in school.

Year 4

This week, the children have been writing their own version of Odd and the Frost Giants from Odd's perspective, using the first person and past tense. They have worked hard to incorporate a variety of conjunctions and extended noun phrases into their writing, making their stories more engaging and descriptive.

In Maths, we have continued learning how to translate shapes on a grid and plot coordinates. The children have made great progress with these skills, remembering to count across the x-axis first and then move up or down along the y-axis.

We have also started a new topic in Design Technology, where the children have been exploring different types of torches. They will soon be designing their own torches, incorporating the knowledge they've gained from their science lessons on electricity and circuits, which they will need to power their creations.

The children have thoroughly enjoyed their music topic this term, where they have been learning about the music of Bill Withers and practising the song 'Lean on Me'.

They are excited to share their final performance, which will be uploaded to the school website for everyone to enjoy.

It has been a pleasure teaching your children over the past two terms, and I am so proud of their hard work and progress. I will miss them all and wish them continued success in the future.

[Year 5](#)

In English, we continued writing our balanced arguments on 'Should we protect properties affected by coastal erosion? We wrote our final two paragraphs 'against' and then finished with a concluding paragraph to give our opinions using the information given. Next, we worked with partners to edit and improve our work, and then published our writing. After the holidays, we will write a balanced argument based on Robot Girl and discuss the question- Should the robot be destroyed?

In Maths this week, we continued our work on division by using partitioning and representations with remainders. We then moved onto using the short-written method to divide a three-digit number by a single-digit number. Next, we used our knowledge of division to solve problems and used 19 matchsticks to find out how many of the same shape could be made and the number of remaining matchsticks. Next, we will continue to solve a range of problems and use efficient methods.

In Art, we continued our unit on 'People in Action' we found out what a montage is and looked at some examples. We explored how we can create montages that will give the illusion of movement by the repeated placement of a figure. We will use the templates that we created this week to create montages after the Easter break.

We hope you all have a lovely Easter break!

Year 6

This week in year 6 we have been working hard towards our SAT's looking at grammar in English finding key vocabulary, looking at relative clauses, present and past progressive and active and passive voice. In reading we have been looking at locating key information to answer a question and discussing pieces of text. In maths we have been looking at statistics and pie charts and graphs.

After the holidays we have 13 days left before our assessments so we will be revising different areas of maths, reading grammar, spellings each day to best prepare us.

Please encourage children to read and do some maths over the break then all the hard work they have put in over the last 6 weeks is forgotten. I know a number of you have bought revision packs or have asked school for extra so this is appreciated.

What Parents & Educators Need to Know about WHATSAPP

WhatsApp is a free messaging service owned by Meta which allows users to send text and voice messages, make video calls, share multimedia – such as images, videos, documents and posts – and have group chats. WhatsApp messages are encrypted, meaning only you and the recipient can view what is sent. While this privacy may sound attractive on paper, this app unfortunately comes with several risks that must be considered – especially for younger users.

WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

EVOLVING SCAMS

WhatsApp's popularity makes it a favourite hunting ground for scammers. Recent examples include sending you the app's QR code, requesting a money transfer because of a supposed emergency and even cases where teenagers trigger an anti-fraud message by attempting to log in to an account, then, warned by WhatsApp, and/or text to ask you to repeat the code back to them, giving access to your private messages and personal information.

CHANNELS

Channels let users follow interests without sharing their phone numbers or sending direct messages, whether posts on a feed and reacting to posts with emojis. However, fraudulent channels can impersonate legitimate organisations, tricking people into sharing personal data and even requesting confidential or illegal services. Unfortunately, many users do not realise that WhatsApp is not the same as other social media, so they may not be aware of the risks of these channels.

FAKE NEWS

WhatsApp's community and ease of use allows news to be shared rapidly – whether it's true or not. To combat this, WhatsApp has introduced a 'fact-checking' feature that allows users to flag fake news. However, this feature is not perfect and some fake news may still spread. It is important to be aware of the risks of fake news and to be able to identify it. WhatsApp may not be able to remove fake news, but it can help you to identify it.

CHAT LOCK

Another new feature named 'Chat Lock' allows users to lock a chat message and prevent the recipient from viewing it. While this sounds like a good idea, it can be used to hide inappropriate content. It can also be used to hide evidence of cyberbullying or other harmful behaviour. It is important to be aware of the risks of this feature and to be able to identify it.

DISAPPEARING MESSAGES

Disappearing messages are useful for sharing sensitive information, but young people may have a false sense of privacy. Disappearing messages disappear after 24 hours, but they can be saved to a phone or a computer. It is important to be aware of the risks of disappearing messages and to be able to identify them.

VISIBLE LOCATION

WhatsApp's 'live location' feature lets users share their location with others. While this is useful, it can also be used to track someone's location. It is important to be aware of the risks of this feature and to be able to identify it.

Advice For Parents & Educators

EMPHASISE CAUTION

Encourage children to read unsolicited messages with caution. Don't share too much information. Consider if sharing is necessary and if it's safe to do so. If you're unsure, it's best to ask a trusted adult.
