The Peer Well-Being Champions are easily identifiable on our playground and will be available to support children at play and lunchtimes. We had a great take up for Parent's Evening on Wednesday – thank you to all who attended. It was a pleasure to share the children's progress and their next steps in learning with you. Attendance

Our attendance target is 96%. Each week the class with the highest attendance receives an award and £5 credit towards an end of year treat. On the last week of term, **Y2** achieved the highest attendance of 99.2%. **WELL DONE!**

Lates

Polite reminder that if your child/ren arrive between 8.55am and 9.15am they will receive a late mark (L) code. If your child/ren arrive after 9.15am they will receive a (U) code which is also an unauthorised late mark. Absences, whether authorised or unauthorised will bring your child/ren's attendance down.

Illnesses

It can be tricky deciding whether or not to keep your child off school, nursery or playgroup when they're unwell. Please see illnesses information below.

Polite reminder that if your child/ren are unwell, please ensure contact is made to the office, via the app or leaving a voicemail on 01226 711488. Please ensure a reason for absence is provided daily.

Leave of Absences

Penalty Notices are requested from schools and **issued by the Local Authority** to the parents/carers of statutory school age children, and can be issued per parent, per child. For example: 3 siblings absent for leave of absence in term time could result in **each** parent/ carer receiving 3 separate fines at the below rates.

- **First offence** - The first time a Penalty Notice is issued the amount will be: £80 per parent, per child paid within 21 days. This fine increases to £160 per parent, per child if paid after day 21, until day 28.
- **Second Offence (within 3 years)** - the second time a Penalty Notice is issued the amount will be £160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days.
- **Third Offence and Any Further Offences (within 3 years)** - the third time an offence is committed a Penalty Notice will not be issued, and the case may be presented straight to the Magistrates' Court under s.444 of the Education Act (1996) or other legal interventions considered. The Magistrates' Court can order fines up to £2500 per parent, per child.


Failure to pay a Penalty Notice will render you liable to criminal proceedings in the Magistrates Court under Section 444 of the Education Act 1996.



School Lunches

Free School Meals

If your child's eligible, you could save up to £400 a year with free school meals. You qualify for free school meals if you receive:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Child Tax Credit with an annual income of less than £16,190, provided you aren't receiving Working Tax Credit
- The 'guaranteed' element of the State Pension Credit
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)
- Universal Credit with an annual net earned income threshold of less than £7400
- Support under part six of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999

Non-payment of school lunches

Children **will not** be provided with a school meal unless it is paid for, except those that are entitled to free school meals.

We recognise that sometimes pupils, parents/carers genuinely forget to pay in advance. In these cases, the Administrative Officer will contact the parent to ask them either; pay dinner money before 10am on line or to bring a packed lunch.

Barnsley Schools Catering - price increase for school lunches

Nursery


In our class discussions we have been talking about Easter and how this is celebrated.

Year 2

This week we have been practicing statements, questions, exclamations and commands in English in preparation for our big write diary entries next week. We have been getting to grips with the 2 x table in Maths and learning about climate zones in Geography.

Next week we will complete our big write pieces and move on to looking at the 10 x tables.

Year 3

In English, we have continued to practise using speech marks in our writing and we have started to read a new book called "The Tin Forest". We have used words for effect when writing different sentence types including simple, compound and complex sentences to describe aspects of the story.

In maths, we have practised subtracting numbers by partitioning them and we have found the difference between 2 two-digit numbers, using blank number lines to support us with our working out.

We got creative in art when we made our special Mother's Day cards and in history we thought about how the Oaks Mining Disaster impacted the families that lost their loved ones.

In P.E., we continued our football unit and we focused on passing a ball accurately and in R.E. this week we continued to read and discuss the Easter story.

Year 4

This week, the children have been learning how to translate shapes on a grid in maths, developing a deeper understanding of movement and position by working with coordinates.

The children have completed a detailed plan for their story rewrite of "*Odd and the Frost Giants*" and started writing a detailed opening paragraph, incorporating a variety of conjunctions and noun phrases.

In Art, the children have finished have evaluated their clay flower pots and are excited to take them home this week.

In Music, the children have been enjoying learning the song "*Lean on Me*", and we've been practising enthusiastically in preparation for next week's final performance.

Year 5

In English this week, we looked at the key features of a balanced argument and identified examples of these on the modelled text. Next, we applied our geography knowledge about coastal erosion to plan and write a balanced argument. Our arguments were to discuss the question 'Should we protect properties affected by coastal erosion? We watched video clips which showed what some of the residents of Happisburgh were going through and how coastal erosion was ruining their lives. Next week, we will edit and publish our work.

In Maths, we have moved onto division this week. We began by using informal methods for division and partitioned two digit numbers in different ways to support this. We spoke about choosing the most efficient method of partitioning to help us to divide two-digit numbers by single-digit numbers, with no remainders or exchanging. Next, we looked at regrouping the tens digit and will extend our learning to include remainders next week.

In Art, we started by exploring some examples of artwork that show movement, particularly body movement. We then practised drawing figures in different poses and commented on how artists use form and figures in movement art. Next, we studied the work of different artists who portray movement in their work, including Muybridge, Boccioni and Delaunay. We looked at the different techniques used to create the illusion of movement. We will then use these pieces as inspiration for our own examples of movement art.

Year 6

This week in year 6 we have been working hard to impress with our practise assessments. These will now show me the gaps we need to plug moving into Summer 1 term.

Well done for the hard work this week. We are all so proud of you.

Next week we are back to working hard in preparation for our SATS looking at the writing features linked to our novel "Boy in the Tower".

In maths we will be moving onto looking at statistics. In PE we are working hard on our athletics unit running long distances, sprinting, and throwing.

We have also continued looking at the different deserts of the world preparing to write a non chronological report.


