Lates

Polite reminder that if your child/ren arrive between 8.55am and 9.15am they will receive a late mark (L) code. If your child/ren arrive after 9.15am they will receive a (U) code which is also an unauthorised late mark. Absences, whether authorised or unauthorised will bring your child/ren's attendance down.

It can be tricky deciding whether or not to keep your child off school, nursery or playgroup when they're unwell. Please see illnesses information below.




Leave of Absences

Penalty Notices are requested from schools and **issued by the Local Authority** to the parents/carers of statutory school age children, and can be issued per parent, per child. For example: 3 siblings absent for leave of absence in term time could result in **each** parent/ carer receiving 3 separate fines at the below rates.

- **First offence** - The first time a Penalty Notice is issued the amount will be: £80 per parent, per child paid within 21 days. This fine increases to £160 per parent, per child if paid after day 21, until day 28.
- **Second Offence (within 3 years)** - the second time a Penalty Notice is issued the amount will be £160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days.
- **Third Offence and Any Further Offences (within 3 years)** - the third time an offence is committed a Penalty Notice will not be issued, and the case may be presented straight to the Magistrates' Court under s.444 of the Education Act (1996) or other legal interventions considered. The Magistrates' Court can order fines up to £2500 per parent, per child.

Failure to pay a Penalty Notice will render you liable to criminal proceedings in the Magistrates Court under Section 444 of the Education Act 1996.

Before & After School Clubs

Breakfast club

Breakfast Club is available daily from 8.00am and the cost of this is £2.50 per session. Sessions can be booked via the school gateway app.

School Lunches

Free School Meals

If your child's eligible, you could save up to £400 a year with free school meals. You qualify for free school meals if you receive:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Child Tax Credit with an annual income of less than £16,190, provided you aren't receiving Working Tax Credit
- The 'guaranteed' element of the State Pension Credit
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)
- Universal Credit with an annual net earned income threshold of less than £7400
- Support under part six of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999

Non-payment of school lunches

Children **will not** be provided with a school meal unless it is paid for, except those that are entitled to free school meals.

We recognise that sometimes pupils, parents/carers genuinely forget to pay in advance. In these cases, the Administrative Officer will contact the parent to ask them either; pay dinner money before 10am on line or to bring a packed lunch.

Barnsley Schools Catering - price increase for school lunches

We have been informed that from 1st April 2025 the price for a school lunch will increase from £2.75 to £3.00. We apologise for any inconvenience this may cause but would encourage parents/carers to apply or check eligibility for free school meals by following the link above.

Nursery

This week in Nursery we have been reading the story of 'The Colour Monster'. We have been discussing different emotions and talking about when we feel these emotions. In Maths, we have been exploring different patterns and trying to describe these.

Next week, we will be looking at the season of 'Spring' where we will be discussing all of the signs of Spring and trying to notice these in our outdoor area. We will be reading the story of 'Little Bear's Spring' to support our learning. In Maths, we will continue with looking at patterns but will be looking at repeating patterns. We will try to continue a repeating pattern by working out what colour or object comes next.

As the weather is beginning to get warmer, please ensure that jumpers and cardigans are named as this makes it easier to return to the correct child. Any un-named items will be placed in lost property at the end of the day.

Reception

We have been reading "I will not ever eat a Tomato" by Lauren Child in our literacy sessions. We have been finding the words used by the author to describe the different fruits and vegetables. We have also thought of some of our own words to describe the different vegetables. I have been really impressed with the super vocabulary our children are using.

In our talking through story sessions we have enjoyed "Zog" and the sequel to this "Zog and the Flying Doctors" by Julia Donaldson. We have been speaking about the key events in the story. We have also been sharing our own opinions by talking about our favourite characters and events.

In our Mathematics we have been learning how to use a number line to help with our calculations.

We have been learning how to jump forwards and backwards for addition and subtraction.

Next week in our Mathematics we will be focussing on number bands to 8 and also doubling. We will be starting to talk about Easter and how this is celebrated.

We have been learning lots of new songs in our singing, poetry and rhyme sessions. It's great to see the confidence that children have when performing these to their friends.

In DT this week, we started to design and make our Castles. We've labelled the features of a castle and discussed its structure.

Year 2

This week we have been introduced to the Great Fire of London book and are preparing to write out diary entry for our big write piece. We are all making lots of amazing progress on Scratch in computing and have learned about kindness in PD. We had a great time practicing ball and net skills in PE.

Next week we will be looking at contractions, statements, exclamations and questions and looking at the 2 and 5 times tables in Maths. We will explore animals around the world in Geography.

Year 3

This week we have really enjoyed swimming and we are improving already!

In English, we have completed our own independent writing. We have written a narrative based on the story of "The Cloud Tea Monkeys" but we have used our own ideas to create our own story.

In maths, we have practised adding two and three-digit numbers together by adjusting numbers. This involved rounding numbers up to the nearest ten to make them easier to add, then remembering to take the ten off again when we get the answer.

In D.T, we designed a cushion and thought carefully about the target audience for our product. We also cut the fabric to begin sewing our cushions next week. In history, we learned about The Coal Mines Act 1872 and how this was passed to keep miners safe whilst they worked in the pits.

In P.E., we enjoyed football this week where we focused on our attacking and defending skills and in science we learned about how seeds are distributed so they can grow and start the life cycle all over again.

In French, we learned about the carnival and how it is celebrated and in music we have continued to learn our class song for this half term.

Year 4

This week in Year 4, the children have been concluding their Maths unit on understanding what happens when a number is multiplied or divided by 10 and 100. They will now begin learning about coordinates.

In Literacy, they have been creating non-chronological reports and summarising key events from "Odd and the Frost Giants", while predicting what might happen in the next chapter.

In Art, the children have designed and created their clay flower pinch pots and bowls, which they will paint next week.

Year 5

In English, we read more of our text 'Robot Girl' and used modal verbs and subordinating conjunctions to make inferences and prediction. Next, we discovered that, the robot AI-E, was in fact Claire's pen pal Maisies, who she had been telling how frustrated she was over her dad not spending time with her. Claire is now left with a dilemma- whether to destroy AI-E or not. We will use this to write our own balanced arguments and discuss the reasons for and against the robot (AI-E) being destroyed.

In Maths, we continued our work on multiplying 3-digit numbers by single-digit numbers using the expanded and short multiplication methods. We used place-value counters on Braining Camp to understand how to carry out the multiple regroupings and then moved on to the short written method. Next, we used estimation to check our calculations and tried to link this to real-life situations. We will move on to division next week.

In design and technology we found out about seasonal food and why some foods that are not in season in Britain, are available in supermarkets all year round. We discussed the benefits and problems around this and discovered that grains can be planted and harvested all year round in Britain. Next, we looked at seasonality charts to find out when different types of foods are available in Britain, this included reared and caught foods.

Year 6

This week we have been looking at ratio in maths and using division and multiplication to find the answer of problems with ratio. Next week is our final assessment before our SATS which will inform us of the areas we need to recap in summer 1 before May. In English we have been writing, editing and publishing our persuasive leaflets ready for our assessment files. Next week we will start looking at different books and questions from them. In DT this week we have

looked at famous inventions throughout time remembering at least 3 inventors and their inventions.
