Dear Parents and Carers,

Mobile Phones

Many children have got into the habit of bringing mobile phones to school. The phones are stored in the school safe and have to be dropped off every morning and collected every night from the school office. This has become a time consuming and unnecessary task for the office staff and it impacts upon learning time for the children themselves. Our children DO NOT need phones in school. If there is a problem whilst the children are in our care, school staff will contact parents. From Monday 17th March 2025, **pupil mobile phones are not to be brought in to school**. Any that are brought into school will go to the school office and will have to be collected by Parents/Carers not children.

Attendance

Our attendance target is 96%. Each week the class with the highest attendance receives an award and £5 credit towards an end of year treat. On the last week of term, **Y1** achieved the highest attendance of 99.3%. **WELL DONE!**

Lates

Polite reminder that if your child/ren arrive between 8.55am and 9.15am they will receive a late mark (L) code. If your child/ren arrive after 9.15am they will receive a (U) code which is also an unauthorised late mark. Absences, whether authorised or unauthorised will bring your child/ren's attendance down.

Illnesses

It can be tricky deciding whether or not to keep your child off school, nursery or playgroup when they're unwell. Please see illnesses information below.

Polite reminder that if your child/ren are unwell, please ensure contact is made to the office, via the app or leaving a voicemail on 01226 711488. Please ensure a reason for absence is provided daily.

Leave of Absences

Penalty Notices are requested from schools and **issued by the Local Authority** to the parents/carers of statutory school age children, and can be issued per parent, per child. For example: 3 siblings absent for leave of absence in term time could result in **each** parent/ carer receiving 3 separate fines at the below rates.

- **First offence** - The first time a Penalty Notice is issued the amount will be: £80 per parent, per child paid within 21 days. This fine increases to £160 per parent, per child if paid after day 21, until day 28.
- **Second Offence (within 3 years)** - the second time a Penalty Notice is issued the amount will be £160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days.
- **Third Offence and Any Further Offences (within 3 years)** - the third time an offence is committed a Penalty Notice will not be issued, and the case may be presented straight to the Magistrates' Court under s.444 of the Education Act (1996) or other legal interventions considered. The Magistrates' Court can order fines up to £2500 per parent, per child.


Failure to pay a Penalty Notice will render you liable to criminal proceedings in the Magistrates Court under Section 444 of the Education Act 1996.



School Lunches

Free School Meals

If your child's eligible, you could save up to £400 a year with free school meals. You qualify for free school meals if you receive:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Child Tax Credit with an annual income of less than £16,190, provided you aren't receiving Working Tax Credit
- The 'guaranteed' element of the State Pension Credit
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)
- Universal Credit with an annual net earned income threshold of less than £7400
- Support under part six of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999

Non-payment of school lunches

Children **will not** be provided with a school meal unless it is paid for, except those that are entitled to free school meals.

We recognise that sometimes pupils, parents/carers genuinely forget to pay in advance. In these cases, the Administrative Officer will contact the parent to ask them either; pay dinner money before 10am on line or to bring a packed lunch.

This week in Nursery, we have been exploring different types of toys and how they work. Our 'Book of the Week' was 'There was an old Dragon who swallowed a Knight'. In Maths, we looked at positional language and tried to move objects into different positions.

Next week, we will be reading the story of 'The Colour Monster' and talking about our emotions. In Maths, we will be exploring different patterns and trying to describe them.

If you have not already booked a Parents Evening appointment, please can you see Miss Wilding. Arrangements can be made for other times or days if needed.

Reception

We have continued our work on Spring this week. We have been discussing the changes that we can see all around us and have created some super close observational drawings of Spring flowers.

We have also been reading stories from our "Dragons and Knights" collections. We have discussed the story, "Zog" in further depth. We have also really enjoyed "Hector and the Big Bad Knight" this week.

In our Mathematics we have been learning how to use a number line to help us find 1 more or 1 less than a given number. We have been learning how to jump forwards and backwards when adding 1 or subtracting 1.

We are all working hard on letter formation and spellings in RWInc groups in a morning. We are also now learning how to write simple sentence with capital letters, finger spaces and full stops.

Next week we will be reading further stories from our "Dragon, Knights and Castles" collection. We will be focussing on subtraction in our Mathematics. In our curriculum work we will be looking at and naming the different parts of a plant.

In maths, we have practised adding two and three-digit numbers together by partitioning them into hundreds, tens and ones.

In R.E., we continued to learn about Easter and the events leading up to Jesus' arrest in the Gethsemane Garden and in history we learned about The Davy lamp and how this had been invented to help keep miners safe after The Oaks Mining Disaster. We continued to learn our class song in music and find the pulse in different songs.

Year 4

Literacy:

This week, the children have been working on writing non-chronological reports about different Viking Gods and Goddesses.

Maths:

In Maths, the class has been multiplying by both 10 and 100 and learning about the inverse of multiplication and exploring the concepts of tenths and hundredths.

A key focus has been understanding the importance of placeholders in number values.

Art:

The children have been practising their skills in blending and toning colours with paints, learning new techniques to bring their plant artwork to life.

Year 5

In English, we continued to read the science-fiction novel 'Robot Girl' and collected information about the two characters Claire and Maisie. We worked in small groups to complete Venn diagrams about the characters and focused on their similarities and differences. After that we used a section of dialogue to add reporting clauses and give more details. Then we looked at a

range of idioms and enjoyed trying to infer their underlying meanings. We will try and include idioms in our writing next week.

In Maths, we continued our work on multiplication by multiplying a three-digit number by a single-digit number, using expanded and short multiplication. We used partitioning and represented the calculations using Base 10 resources and place value counters. We then moved on to regrouping the tens and hundreds. Next week, we will use estimation and move on to division.

In Geography, we completed our topic on Coasts by looking at the different coastal management strategies and the positives and negatives of protecting our coastal towns and villages. We found out that, although these strategies can help prevent and stop erosion, they are very expensive and can cause more erosion to take place further along the coast. We also completed quizzes to test our knowledge and recall the important facts from the topic. Next week we will begin a new design and technology topic on Seasonal Foods.

Year 6

This week in year 6 we have been working on fractions in maths. We have recapped adding and subtracting fractions and looked at the method behind multiplying two fractions together. We have also looked at multiplying fractions by a integer and looked at dividing fractions by integers. Next week we will be looking at statistics and ratio in maths. In English, we have looked at persuasive leaflets writing paragraphs about Camp Green Lake and planned our own leaflet about a well-known place. We have started writing our leaflet today and will complete it next week.

In reading we have concentrated on vocabulary this week trying to find the meaning of different words. We have also had a huge focus on Grammar and punctuation looking at SAT's style problems in pairs.

Football

This week both boys and girls had fixtures.

The girls travelled to Milefield where they came out on top in a really great match with Savannah and India scoring the goals. Carter Class 3 was the lass on the grass after showing no fear and creating many attempts with her tenacity.

The boys won 12-2 in a rearranged match against Birkwood!

Goals were shared around with Logan and Jack C Class 5 scoring four a piece, Brodie two and Robbie and Seth getting one each.


