Dear Parents and Carers,

This week please take note of the following information and reminders.

### **February half term holiday and INSET Day**

Today we break up for our February half term holiday. The children will return to school on Tuesday 25 February 2025 due to a staff training day with our Trust colleagues on the Monday of that week.

### **Jewellery and PE**

Sadly some children are beginning to wear jewellery to school. Our policies clearly state that jewellery *must not* be worn to school with the exception of small stud earrings. This is for Health and Safety reasons, unavoidable accidents can happen if children are running around at play and lunch times whilst wearing jewellery. Earrings *must be removed on PE days or covered* by tape which parents/carers must provide along with PE kits on the PE days for your child(ren)'s class. Staff will not remove jewellery for your child.

### **Online Safety continued support for Parents/Carers**

Thank you to those parents/carers who attended the Online Safety workshop on Wednesday this week. We hope you found it useful. As I am sure you will agree online safety is a worry for all parents. As a school we see the negative effects of; children's exposure to content through gaming which is too old for them, tiredness as children have been using screens late and for lengthy periods, difficulties with social situations and communication as children are not interacting on a personal level and overstimulation due to advanced graphics. It is our belief that we need to work together to support our children.

As a direct result we will be introducing an *Online Pledge* with the children during assembly on Wednesday 26th February to support them to stay safe while using the internet. *At 3pm on Wednesday 26th February Mrs Lassu will be holding a Parent's Meeting* in the school hall to introduce and share Ladywood's Online Pledge with family members so that we are all supporting our children in the same way. We look forward to seeing you at the meeting so that we can begin our 'Home/School' approach to ensuring our children get the best from the internet but avoid the negative aspects of technology.

In addition we will be sharing information with parents every half term to support you to ensure your child is safe online. A poster from the National Online Safety group 'What Parents and Carers need to know about Social Media and Mental Health,' is attached to this newsletter for you to read. These posters are extremely useful.

## Lates

Polite reminder that if your child/ren arrive between 8.55am and 9.15am they will receive a late mark (L) code. If your child/ren arrive after 9.15am they will receive a (U) code which is also an unauthorised late mark. Absences, whether authorised or unauthorised will bring your child/ren's attendance down.

## Illnesses

It can be tricky deciding whether or not to keep your child off school, nursery or playgroup when they're unwell. Please see illnesses information below.

Polite reminder that if your child/ren are unwell, please ensure contact is made to the office, via the app or leaving a voicemail on 01226 711488. Please ensure a reason for absence is provided daily.

## Leave of Absences

Penalty Notices are requested from schools and **issued by the Local Authority** to the parents/carers of statutory school age children, and can be issued per parent, per child. For example: 3 siblings absent for leave of absence in term time could result in **each** parent/ carer receiving 3 separate fines at the below rates.

- **First offence** - The first time a Penalty Notice is issued the amount will be: £80 per parent, per child paid within 21 days. This fine increases to £160 per parent, per child if paid after day 21, until day 28.
- **Second Offence (within 3 years)** - the second time a Penalty Notice is issued the amount will be £160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days.
- **Third Offence and Any Further Offences (within 3 years)** - the third time an offence is committed a Penalty Notice will not be issued, and the case may be presented straight to the Magistrates' Court under s.444 of the Education Act (1996) or other legal interventions considered. The Magistrates' Court can order fines up to £2500 per parent, per child.

**Failure to pay a Penalty Notice will render you liable to criminal proceedings in the Magistrates Court under Section 444 of the Education Act 1996.**



In Maths, we will be practising our careful counting and trying to match the numeral to the amount. We will also be creating our own model dragons out of different resources.

## Reception

This week we have been researching further the festival, Chinese New Year. We have been discussing the similarities between this festival and our own celebrations. We have used our own pictures and captions to record our work.

In our "Talk Through Story" sessions we have been reading, "The Koala Who Could". This is about a little Koala who discovers the joy of trying new things. This has led to a super discussion around feelings and emotions and how at times we all need to be brave. I am always very impressed as to how well the children participate in class discussions with a super use of vocabulary.



## Year 1

Another busy half term in Year 1. The children have made lots of progress this half term and have produced some brilliant work. We have been busy working on our writing and building sentences with each other. The children loved reading "Beegu" and have had some fun creating their own aliens to tell a story.

There has been some wow work in maths this half term. We have been growing our confidence in adding and subtracting numbers within 10.

Children have explored weather patterns in Geography and have learned why we have day and night.

In RE we have been looking at our wonderful world and the creation story.

After half term, we will be celebrating World Book Day and enjoying a workshop at the Barnsley Museum based on our History learning about Toys – old and new.

## Year 2

This week we have been looking at adding and taking away 10 from 2 digit numbers and looking at number patterns to help us. We have collected all the information we need for our big write reports about the Minpins and have completed our half termly History, Geography and Science assessments. After the holidays we will be exploring multiplication patterns in Maths and looking at a story about "The Great Fire of London", we will also be completing our final pieces in Art.

**Polite notice:** Please could ask parents that for safeguarding reasons they avoid looking through the windows into the Year 2 classroom, this has often happened when children are getting changed from PE and as you can appreciate this needs to be a safeguarded time for the children. Thank you for you co-operation.

## Year 3

In English, we have written our instructions for how to make a snozzcumber cake. We have included imperative verbs and adverbs in our writing and we have also practised some of the Year 3 spelling rules, such as 'ture.'

In maths, we have continued to focus on measurement and we have solved mathematical problems related to this too.

In science, we have learned about the reproductive parts of a plant and the function of the flower. In Personal Development, we have discussed what it takes to be a good friend and in P.E, we have concluded our unit on Dance by putting different movements into a sequence.

In R.E., we have continued to learn about Sikhism and the specific places that are special to Sikhs. In art, we were very excited to be architects and design our own buildings and in music we have reached the end of our current unit and we performed our class song.

Thank you for your continued support and we hope you all have a well-earned rest over the half-term holiday.

## Year 4

This week, the children have been writing their own mystical stories based on "*Cinnamon*", focusing on using speech, correct punctuation, noun phrases, and sentences with subordinating conjunctions.

Next term, we will begin a new book: "*Odd and the Frost Giants*", by the same author, Neil Gaiman.

In Maths, we have been learning about factors, multiplicative structures, and representations. The children have also learned some new concepts, including commutativity and the distributive law. Next, we will use our knowledge of the distributive law to solve two-part addition problems.

In French, the children have continued to learn about the parts of the face and have been creating their own aliens. They have also been writing sentences in French to describe their aliens, practising new vocabulary and sentence structures.

In History, we have studied the Spanish Armada, and the children have now finished their topic on Queen Elizabeth I. Next term, we will be making clay pots in Design Technology.

## Year 5

In English, we planned our own tense nightmare sequences and began to write our first drafts this week. We used the same sequence as in Fliss's dream and included some of the key features covered in this unit. We included short sentences to build suspense, and figurative language through personification, similes, metaphors and onomatopoeia. Next we will edit and publish our work.

In Whole Class Read, we looked at more 'Real Life Mysteries' and had some great discussions about 'Monsters of the deep'. We studied the case files from key witnesses and even watched a video clip so we could hear the key witnesses describe what they saw.

In Maths, we started a new unit on short multiplication and division. We used 'Braining Camp' on the iPads to use place value counters to make arrays and Base 10 blocks to partition 2-digit numbers when multiplying them by a single digit number. Next, we will begin to use expanded and short multiplication to multiply 2-digit numbers by single digit numbers.

In Geography, we continued to look at depositional and erosional features and identified these on maps. Next, we identified the human and physical features of a coastal town and discussed some of the ways that these can be protected from erosion of the sea. After half term, we will look at how beaches are formed and look at how erosion can impact coastal towns and villages.

We hope you all have a lovely half term break and want to thank you for your continued support.

## Year 6

Another busy week in year 6 where we have been looking at dividing larger numbers and looking at converting fractions decimals and percentages. In English we have written, edited and published our non-chronological beasts. In the wider curriculum we have been researching deserts of the world to create fact files.

Children have taken home spelling sheets from the last 5 years SATs spellings which they will need to practise as these rules will most likely come up in May. Improving spelling scores could be the difference between passing the Y6 GPS SAT at an expected level or being working towards.

**We cannot stress how important it is for the children to learn these spellings over the holidays.**

Boosters will continue after the holidays and it is useful for all children to attend these as we have teachers giving expert advice on specific areas of the curriculum that has already been covered in year 6 and may have been forgotten. Arithmetic will have a key focus after the holidays which is an easy practise at home so it would be lovely if you could do some of this in any spare time.

Well done to the children who got their treat on Thursday for having reading diaries in and signed on a daily basis.

Have a really great break ready for a really busy and challenging half term where we will be continuing our preparations for the SAT's in the second week of May.




