Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope you have all had a lovely week.

This week I would like to share some information about online safety. Activity online is worrying for us all and in school we educate children on the risks of online but we do find that a lot of our children are exposed to content that is too old for them. Most children have frequent access to the internet and online apps and while we can educate them it takes a home/school approach to monitor their usage. As a direct result we are offering support to parents/carers and endeavouring to establish joint working partnership to protect our children. Next week on Wednesday 12th February at 2pm until 3pm we will be offering a workshop for parents/carers run by Compass Be, our safeguarding partners, to provide advice, support and resources for parents to support their child(ren) to be safe online. Please see the online form to complete under safeguarding to secure your attendance. Going forward we aim to share online safety posters with you half termly with tips to support your child(ren) and, after the holidays we will invite parents to another meeting to establish an home/school online safety pledge. More information about this will follow in due course.

We have had lots of illness in school amongst staff and children these last couple of weeks – thank you to all who have followed the correct procedures and informed us of absence. Please continue to work with the office staff to ensure we receive daily updates when your child is poorly. We hope everyone manages to recover over the weekend and is able to return to school for our final week of this half term.

Attendance

Our attendance target is 96%. Each week the class with the highest attendance receives an award and £5 credit towards an end of year treat. Last week, **Y5** achieved the highest attendance of 97.3%. **WELL DONE!**

Lates

Polite reminder that if your child/ren arrive between 8.55am and 9.15am they will receive a late mark (L) code. If your child/ren arrive after 9.15am they will receive a (U) code which is also an unauthorised late mark. Absences, whether authorised or unauthorised will bring your child/ren's attendance down.

Illnesses

It can be tricky deciding whether or not to keep your child off school, nursery or playgroup when they're unwell. Please see illnesses information below.

Polite reminder that if your child/ren are unwell, please ensure contact is made to the office, via the app or leaving a voicemail on 01226 711488. Please ensure a reason for absence is provided daily.

Leave of Absences

Penalty Notices are requested from schools and **issued by the Local Authority** to the parents/carers of statutory school age children, and can be issued per parent, per child. For example: 3 siblings absent for leave of absence in term time could result in **each** parent/ carer receiving 3 separate fines at the below rates.

- **First offence** - The first time a Penalty Notice is issued the amount will be: £80 per parent, per child paid within 21 days. This fine increases to £160 per parent, per child if paid after day 21, until day 28.
- **Second Offence (within 3 years)** - the second time a Penalty Notice is issued the amount will be £160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days.
- **Third Offence and Any Further Offences (within 3 years)** - the third time an offence is committed a Penalty Notice will not be issued, and the case may be presented straight to the Magistrates' Court under s.444 of the Education Act (1996) or other legal interventions considered. The Magistrates' Court can order fines up to £2500 per parent, per child.


Failure to pay a Penalty Notice will render you liable to criminal proceedings in the Magistrates Court under Section 444 of the Education Act 1996.




After School Clubs



World Book Day - Thursday 6th March 2025

World Book Day will take place on Thursday 6th March. Our hard working school council have been busy organising our school events. For World Book Day, children can come to school wearing their Pyjamas for "snuggle and read" sessions. Children will be asked to bring their favourite book into school in order to share their recommendation with their peers.

We will be doing art work based on our favourite books and characters in order to inform others of our top reads.

Parents will also be invited into school at the end of the day to share books and stories with the children. Further details will be sent out nearer to the time.

A big thank you to our school council who do a tremendous job at organising our events. We always enjoy our World Book Day!

Nursery

This week in Nursery, we have been reading the story of 'Hansel and Gretel'. We have read different versions of the story and tried to compare the different parts. We have also explored items that float and items that sink. We have tried to predict what might happen. In Maths, we have been exploring 2D shapes by trying to name them and describe what they look like.

Next week, we will continue to explore 2D shapes and try to describe them. We will also be exploring magnets by testing which objects in our classroom is magnetic and which are not.

Reception

This week we have been finding out how Chinese New Year is celebrated. We have been talking about the different events and activities that take place during the celebrations. We have compared this to how we celebrate special events.

We have used non-fiction books very well to research the topic. We have been exploring the features of a non-fiction book and how these differ to a fiction book.

In our Mathematics we have been working on calculation. We have used lots of different resources to help us with our addition. We have also been focussing on the number bands to 6. We have been finding all the different ways that we can make 6.

We are learning how to write our own number sentences to record our work.

We are continuing to enjoy our weekly PE sessions. I am really impressed with the growing independence children are showing when changing and dressing for PE.


Please make sure your child has their PE kit in school every Friday. Also please ensure your child brings their book bag to school every day.

Year 1

Year One have had a great week. We have been busy adding numbers to 10 in Maths and swapping the numbers round to make the sum.

In English, we wrote a letter to Beegu offering some advice to her. Year One have loved learning about Beegu and her alien language.

In Geography this week, we have explored weather patterns and learned why we have different seasons.

Year One used great team playing skills in PE this week, they enjoyed playing a game of bench ball and have been practising their throwing skills.

Year 2

This week we have been exploring 10 more and 10 less in Maths and we have moved on to leaning new skills for our next big write which is a non-chronological report about the "Minpins", we looked at structures of reports including subheadings and interesting adjectives. We did an amazing job at creating a colour wheel in Art and did a spot of map reading in Geography. Next week we will be putting all our new skills learned in all of our lessons to the test in our end of unit assessments.

Year 3

In English, we have continued to practise using speech marks in our writing. We wrote a diary extract in role as Sophie when she meets the BFG and we had to include speech marks and prepositions. We also edited our own work to correct our own mistakes.

In maths, we have focused on measurement this week. This has involved working out the weight of various objects (in grams) as well as measuring the volume (in millilitres and litres) in a range of containers.

In science, we have looked at the leaves of a plant and how they use photosynthesis to make food.

In Personal Development, we discussed our own feelings and identified situations when we have felt them.

In P.E., we have continued our unit of Dance and we have demonstrated a range of movements linked to wild animals.

In R.E., we have learned about the place of worship for Sikhs and the specific places that are special to them.

In art, we looked at the Sydney Opera House and we made our own collage of this famous landmark.

In geography, we labelled the eight different points of a compass and we practised giving directions.

A reminder that our P.E. day has changed to Thursday so children will require their full kit in school.

Year 4

This week, the children have written a diary entry focusing on different subordinating clauses and have begun writing their own version of "*Cinnamon*". Next week, we will continue with this.

In Maths, we have been learning about square numbers and the divisibility rules for 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 8, and 10. Next week, we will be looking at factors, multiplicative structures, and representations.

In History, we have learned about Sir Francis Drake and Sir Walter Raleigh, and next week, we will be learning about the Spanish Armada.

The children are continuing to learn basketball in PE.

Year 5

In English, we continued our work on figurative language by looking at examples of symbolism, hyperbole, alliteration, personification and onomatopoeia. We looked at how Robert Swindells used some of these to describe Fliss's nightmare and how they are used sparingly throughout a text. Next, we chose a scene from the nightmare and used figurative language to describe it. We will plan and write our own tense nightmare sequence next week.

In Whole Class Read, we re-read the last few chapters of "Room 13" and discussed them in more detail. The children then showed great teamwork skills when completing a quiz based on Chapter 27.

In Maths, we completed our unit on negative numbers. We explained how negative numbers are used on coordinate grids and read and plotted coordinates in all four quadrants. We then used our knowledge of positive and negative numbers to interpret graphs and solved problems in a range of contexts.

In Geography, we continued our new topic on coasts and compared this with seeing it first hand on our residential trip last week. We continued to look at depositional and erosional features and identified these on maps and using photographs.

Year 6

This week in Year 6 we have been completing our assessments and I am so proud of the efforts of all the children. We have also planned and started to write our own independent non-chronological reports based on beasts that we have created ourselves. In the wider curriculum time, we have reviewed the papers we have sat as well as found out the location of major deserts in the world and also compared the temperatures and structures of some different deserts.


