Lates

Polite reminder that if your child/ren arrive between 8.55am and 9.15am they will receive a late mark (L) code. If your child/ren arrive after 9.15am they will receive a (U) code which is also an unauthorised late mark. Absences, whether authorised or unauthorised will bring your child/ren's attendance down.

It can be tricky deciding whether or not to keep your child off school, nursery or playgroup when they're unwell. Please see illnesses information below.


Leave of Absences

Penalty Notices are requested from schools and **issued by the Local Authority** to the parents/carers of statutory school age children, and can be issued per parent, per child. For example: 3 siblings absent for leave of absence in term time could result in **each** parent/ carer receiving 3 separate fines at the below rates.

- **First offence** - The first time a Penalty Notice is issued the amount will be: £80 per parent, per child paid within 21 days. This fine increases to £160 per parent, per child if paid after day 21, until day 28.
- **Second Offence (within 3 years)** - the second time a Penalty Notice is issued the amount will be £160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days.
- **Third Offence and Any Further Offences (within 3 years)** - the third time an offence is committed a Penalty Notice will not be issued, and the case may be presented straight to the Magistrates' Court under s.444 of the Education Act (1996) or other legal interventions considered. The Magistrates' Court can order fines up to £2500 per parent, per child.

Failure to pay a Penalty Notice will render you liable to criminal proceedings in the Magistrates Court under Section 444 of the Education Act 1996.

Year 3

In literacy this week, we have finished off our independent writing task where we had to write in role as an evacuee. We also completed a book review of our 'The Lion and the Unicorn' book by Shirley Hughes. Most of us gave the book 5 stars as we have really enjoyed learning even more about what life was like for evacuees during WW2.

In maths, we have practised adding and subtracting tens from multiples of 100. We have used the number facts we already know to help us to do this. We also had a go at solving word problems involving this skill too.

In history, we have discussed the key events in WW2 and why the war ended. We are sad to see this topic come to an end but we have learned so much about it! In D.T. we have designed a healthy pancake that we will make in school after the Christmas holidays. In PD we looked at resolving conflict and had to explain what we would do in some situations. In French, we put numbers, days and months together to learn how to write the date and in science we looked at different pictures of fossils and organised them into groups. We learnt why fossils are so important.

On Friday we will be having a Christmas craft afternoon in Year 3, making lots of exciting Christmas crafts and listening to Christmas music.

Year 5

In our topic sessions, we added the final touches to our Christmas cards and calendars and the children are looking forward to sharing them with you.

This week we have been completing our units of work ready to start fresh after Christmas.

In Maths, we have been subtracting multiples of powers of 10 crossing the millions boundary, understanding the composition of seven digit numbers, estimating and identifying numbers on number lines and solving problems using column addition and subtraction. In the new year, we will be rounding and solving problems with numbers up to 7 digits.

In English, we have been writing our balanced argument based on the "Pig Heart Boy". Our balanced argument has been discussing whether Cameron should or should not have a pig's heart transplant. We have had to make sure we include all features of a balanced argument and then we have edited and improved our writing before publishing it in neat.

On Wednesday, we had a whole school trip to the Lamproom Theatre to watch "Sleeping Beauty" Pantomime and it was brilliant! Everyone thoroughly enjoyed themselves and said it was a really funny show!
