Lates

Polite reminder that if your child/ren arrive between 8.55am and 9.15am they will receive a late mark (L) code. If your child/ren arrive after 9.15am they will receive a (U) code which is also an unauthorised late mark. Absences, whether authorised or unauthorised will bring your child/ren's attendance down.

It can be tricky deciding whether or not to keep your child off school, nursery or playgroup when they're unwell. Please see illnesses information below.


Leave of Absences

Penalty Notices are requested from schools and **issued by the Local Authority** to the parents/carers of statutory school age children, and can be issued per parent, per child. For example: 3 siblings absent for leave of absence in term time could result in **each** parent/ carer receiving 3 separate fines at the below rates.

- **First offence** - The first time a Penalty Notice is issued the amount will be: £80 per parent, per child paid within 21 days. This fine increases to £160 per parent, per child if paid after day 21, until day 28.
- **Second Offence (within 3 years)** - the second time a Penalty Notice is issued the amount will be £160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days.
- **Third Offence and Any Further Offences (within 3 years)** - the third time an offence is committed a Penalty Notice will not be issued, and the case may be presented straight to the Magistrates' Court under s.444 of the Education Act (1996) or other legal interventions considered. The Magistrates' Court can order fines up to £2500 per parent, per child.

Failure to pay a Penalty Notice will render you liable to criminal proceedings in the Magistrates Court under Section 444 of the Education Act 1996.

To download the app on your **smartphone**, search School Gateway in your App store and download:

To use the online version on a **computer** go to: <https://schoolgateway.co.uk/get-started/>, click on the web version link and follow the instructions

How to activate your account

1. Download the Android or iPhone app.

2. Press 'Sign Up' then enter the email and mobile number your school has on record. If you're not sure if they have the right details, it's best to check and update first.
3. Press 'Send PIN'. You will receive a text message with your unique PIN.
4. You're now ready to log in and start using School Gateway.
5. If you don't have a smartphone or prefer to use a computer, ~~you can set up~~ your account using the web version of School Gateway.



Nursery

This week in Nursery, we have been talking about Christmas and why we have Christmas. In Maths, we have been practising our careful counting.

Next week, we will be comparing the weight of different objects by weighing different objects and presents.

On Monday, we have our Christmas performance. Please can you ensure your child wears white pants so their underwear is not seen underneath their costume. Parents will be able to take their children home early once staff have got the children changed back into their school uniform.

On Wednesday, we have our Christmas Party. Please come to school in party clothes. Any donations of food would be greatly welcomed.

Children can come to school on Thursday and Friday in their Christmas Jumpers.

Please remember that Morning Nursery starts at 9 and finishes at 12 and Afternoon starts at 12 and finishes at 3. Staff ensure that the door is opened promptly at these times and it can be extremely difficult to let in children who are late due to staffing. If you are going to be late for any reason, please can you inform the office.

Reception

We have thoroughly enjoyed reading stories from our Christmas collection. A couple of our favourites have been, "One Snowy Night" by Nick Butterworth and "The Stick Man" by Julia

Donaldson. After reading our story we use our talk partners to discuss the story in depth and to give our own opinions about the story.

In our Mathematics this week we have been working on repeating patterns. We have been using shapes and other resources to create our own repeating patterns. In our Mastering Number Sessions we have been focussing on adding 1 and subtracting 1. We are also learning how to record our own work.

In our curriculum sessions we have been focussing on our own Christmas preparations and the Nativity story. We have used our own pictures and words to record how Christmas is celebrated.


Next week we are looking forward to performing our Nativity play for our families. We are excited about our Christmas party on Wednesday.

Year 2

As we get closer to Christmas we have made our Christmas cards and calendars this week. They look fantastic! We have finished our information page all about dodos and the children have tried really hard. We have also recapped strategies to add and subtract. The children are building fluency with these strategies. We have explored seaside habitats more this week. We have also sorted living and non-living things that might be found on the beach. I would like to say a big thank you from all the year 2 adults for coming to watch our nativity performance, your support means a lot. We have lots of festive things planned for next week, we are all really looking forwards to our last week together before the holidays.

Year 3

This week we enjoyed performing in our Snow White Christmas production. We worked so hard to learn the songs and everyone was super proud of us!

In literacy this week, we have written an independent piece of writing pretending that we are an evacuee in World War 2. We have written to our parents about how it feels to be sent away from our home and families.

In maths, we have represented numbers as an amount of tens and we have practised partitioning three digit numbers in different ways using equipment to help us.

In history, we have learned about rationing during World War 2 and how miners contributed to the war and why they did not fight.

We have also been making our Christmas cards and calendars this week. We can't wait to take these home and show them to our families.

Year 4

This week has been a week of practising the concert and assessments where we have tried really hard in our English and maths quizzes. We have also designed our DT bags and learnt about different fastenings. In French we have looked at the nouns for shops and practised them in French. In writing we have continued with retelling the 'Iron Man' story and in maths we have looked at the 6 times table. We have also completed some soundchecks on TT Rockstars to see the improvements children have made throughout the term.

Year 5

This week in Maths, the children have completed assessments to check their progress and understanding across the topics covered so far. We completed our unit on 'Money' by using and explaining the most efficient strategies when subtracting quantities of money. We also found the change when purchasing several items. Next week, we will begin to look at negative numbers.

In English we continued our work on 'The Tempest' and did some work around figurative language. We began by looking at personification and identified examples within sentences and then within the story. Next, we worked with partners to create our own examples of personification and used a thesaurus to find appropriate synonyms to replace the verb. Next week, we will plan and write a setting description using figurative language.

This week in History, we found out about the Roman invasion of Britain. We learnt how the emperor Claudius needed to prove that he wasn't weak, so he decided to invade Britain and fight the wild Celtic tribes to prove himself. We looked carefully at the tactics he and his legionaries used and the weapons they carried. Next week, we will learn about Boudica's rebellion against the Roman rule.

Year 6

This week in Year 6 has been another Mock SAT's week. We have tried really hard and already we are starting to see progress in our learning! Mrs Bradbury is really proud of all our hard work and would like to say well done to those children who have attended all booster sessions - your hard work has really paid off!

In English, we have continued with practising our skills ready to plan and write our balanced arguments next week. By the end of next week, we will write our own balanced argument based on 'Should Cameron have a pigs-heart or not?'

This week has also been our Christmas Concerts of Snow White and the 7 dwarfs at Christmas. Everyone put on a fantastic show and sang amazingly. We really have some brilliant actors and singers in this class - watch this space!

Next week is our last week before the Christmas holidays! It will be full of festive fun and cheer, a trip to the pantomime and enjoyment after hard weeks work this week.
