

How to activate your account

1. Download the Android or iPhone app.

3. Press 'Send PIN'. You will receive a text message with your unique PIN.
4. You're now ready to log in and start using School Gateway.
5. If you don't have a smartphone or prefer to use a computer, you can set up your account using **the web version** of School Gateway.

Year 2

What a super busy half term! The children have worked extremely hard. Their writing is improving lots. The children are trying so hard with their spellings, handwriting and punctuation. In maths, all the children have a better understanding of 2-digit numbers and we are starting to understand how to add efficiently. We have completed our art, science and history units. The children can remember lots!

A big well done from all the adults in year 2! Keep working hard.

Year 3

This week in Whole Class Reading we have continued to read and perform a range of poems. We have really enjoyed it and we were keen to discuss our favourites.

In English, we have written our own non-chronological report about an animal of our choice. We have used all the features we have learned about in class such as headings, sub-headings and subordinate conjunctions to improve our writing.

In maths, we have been learning how to measure using centimetres and millimetres. We have also moved onto converting between the two too.

In computing, we have focused on electrical devices, including inputting, outputting and how information is processed.

In art this week, we have used all the information we have learned about pointillism to create our own piece of art work using George Seurat's technique.

We really enjoyed our Halloween disco this week and we loved dressing up in our spooky costumes!

Please could we remind parents that children need their P.E. kits in school every Wednesday and Friday (please also include outdoor trainers). We also kindly ask that long hair is tied back and any jewellery is removed ready for our lessons.

Also, over the half term holiday it would really benefit your child if you could access Literacy Shed and TT Rockstars to allow them to keep up with spellings and times tables at home.

Year 4

This week in year 4 we have been looking at punctuating speech correctly in English and we will look at this more after the holidays along with starting our novel of The Iron Man. In Maths, we have compared and ordered four digit numbers and also looked at rounding numbers. We have rounded to the nearest thousand. We will round to the nearest hundred and ten after the holidays. In the wider curriculum we have had our Halloween themed activities and lunch. We also had our swim safety talk and looked at water safety when we went to the pool on Monday.

Have a fantastic break trick or treating in your costumes next week ready to come back for bonfire and Remembrance activities.

Year 5

In Maths this week, we used our knowledge of decimal place value to solve problems in different contexts. After that, we calculated with decimal numbers up to and bridging one tenth and then applied this knowledge when adding decimals using column addition and subtraction. Next, we will round decimal numbers with hundredths to the nearest tenth and whole number

In English, we designed our own rovers and added expanded labels to give details. We used noun phrases and key vocabulary to add details and presented our work on blueprint paper. After half term, we will use our detailed diagrams to write an expanded explanation of our rovers.

In topic, we continued our work on geometric patterns and created our final designs, which we will trace and add on to the lino using tracing paper. After half term, we will use lino cutters to cut our geometric patterns into the lino and use these to create prints.

On Wednesday, to celebrate our Harry Potter Day, we took part in a virtual Harry Potter lesson and created our own magical settings. Next, we followed step-by-step instructions and drew Hogwarts School of Witchcraft and Wizardry.

We have had some amazing pieces of homework handed in over the last few weeks, on our science topic 'Earth and Space', and want to say a big well done to the children who have brought pieces in.

We would also like to thank our children and families for their hard work and support over the half term and wish you all a lovely half term break.

Year 6

This week in Year 6, we have been completing our first Mock SAT's. We hope you can see the benefit of practising these types of tests at an early stage, as we would like to prepare your child as much as possible to feel comfortable and confident.

Your child has had feedback on what they have done well and where they need to improve. It is important that we are all supportive of your child's achievements and we are encouraging your child to have a positive attitude when completing these kinds of tests. It is also important to note that there is still a lot of learning to be covered in Year 6 so therefore they would not have known how to complete some of the questions.

In the afternoons, we have been completing our independent writing of a flashback narrative. We have spent some time completing, editing and improving these. Once we were happy with our improvements, we have then published these ready to be assessed. Mrs Bradbury is looking forward to reading our stories over the half term.

On Wednesday, we celebrated Halloween by getting dressed up and boy, did we go to town! We have clowns, dead brides, witches, dead footballers, wolves and lots of other creative ideas. Mrs Bradbury loved seeing the effort and creativity Year 6 went to with their costumes. In the afternoon, we made Harry Potter Howlers and played Mrs Bradbury's famous Pirate Game but in a Halloween version. We loved it!




