## Nursery

This week in Nursery, we have been learning about Space. We have spoken about the different objects that we can find in Space. In Maths, we have been looking at 2D shapes and exploring what they look like.

Next week, we will continue to look at Space but creating our own space art. We will also be looking at the celebration of Halloween and reading some lovely Halloween books.

On Wednesday, we will be having our Halloween Craft Afternoon which will start at 2pm for all children.

## Reception

We have been continuing to explore woodland animals and the seasonal changes that are occurring. We have been using describing words when exploring leaves, conkers, shells, trees etc. We are learning how to use an extended range of vocabulary in conversations with others.

In our talk through story sessions we have been reading "Whatever Next" by Jill Murphy. This is a super story about the adventures of a little boy and how he uses his imagination. We have used drama and role play very well to re-enact different scenes.

In our Mathematics we have continued to extend our work on "more" and "fewer". We have compared different amounts and have solved simple problems. We have also been exploring shape and pattern. We have been naming 2D shapes and have used shapes to create our own repeating patterns.

Next week we will use the story, "Whatever Next" to explore space and planets.

We are looking forward to our Halloween Crafts event.

In our Mathematics we will be exploring 3D shapes.

Well done to Reception children for working so hard and giving your best every day.

## Year 1

Year One have been busy with lots of learning again this week. In Maths, we have continued partitioning and combining numbers 1-5 and have now progressed to the composition of numbers 6-10, using the five and a bit structure. Boys and girls have worked well as a team this week to complete their learning.

In PE, we did some gymnastics and learned some different sitting and standing positions, the children worked well to combine movements together and perform them within a team!

We have been very excited about our Halloween Crafts Day - next Wednesday! We look forward to seeing you all in the afternoon for fun, crafts and a spooktacular time!!!

Last week, we all went down to the library to change our reading for pleasure books. The boys and girls really enjoyed spending some quality time with a book.

Please ensure children are also bringing their book bags every day as we may change books for RWI at different points too. It is really important that your child keeps up with their reading practice at home. Thank you for your continued support with this.

## Year 2

This week we have discovered that there is another fairy tale criminal on the loose. The children have written wanted posters thinking carefully to make sure their descriptions were accurate. They have all done a fabulous job!!! In Maths we have moved on to adding three 1 digit numbers in ten and the children have done really well with this. In science we have continued to talk about offspring. Learning about how mammals have babies and how reptiles, birds and fish lay eggs. We have also thought about what every animal needs to survive. Next week, is our Halloween parent craft event. Children are allowed to come into school that day dressed in their Halloween costume.

## Year 3

This week in Whole Class Reading we have been reading riddles aloud and we have begun to write our own too.

In English, we have continued to learn about the features of a non-chronological report and we have looked at how to organise information under sub-headings and how to use subordinate conjunctions in our writing. We were very excited to write about an unusual animal called a capybara.

In Maths, we have been learning how to measure using centimeters and meters and how to convert from one unit of measure to the other.

In P.E., we have worked towards performing our sequences including a symmetrical and asymmetrical balance.

In art this week, we have looked at other artists who have used pointillism in their work, including Paul Signac. We have recreated some of his work using the pointillism technique.

In R.E. this week, we have looked at the Hinduism religion and we have spoken about Diwali and what this celebration involves.

Please could we remind parents to ensure that children have their P.E. kits in school every Wednesday and Friday (please also include outdoor trainers). We also kindly ask that long hair is tied back and any jewellery is removed ready for our lessons.

## Year 4

This week we have been writing up our explanations in English and next week we will be looking at punctuating speech ready for after the holidays and writing a story.

In Maths we have been partitioning 4 digit numbers in different ways. Next week we will be rounding 4 digit numbers.

In History we have been looking at the new police force in Victorian England and the education act of 1891.

In PE we have been looking at what we would do if we were tagged in rugby as well as passing the ball. In the wider curriculum we have been looking at Climate change in PD and Dewali in RE.

## Year 5

In Maths this week, we continued our work on hundredths and explained how decimals with hundredths can be partitioned in different ways. We then used this knowledge to compare meters and centimeters. After that, we looked at length by converting between centimeters and meters. Next week, we will solve problems in different contexts and use column addition and subtraction to calculate with decimals.

In English, we learnt about relative clauses and then linked this to writing about Mars and Mars rovers. We watched a video, which informed us of the Mars rovers that have already been sent into space, and wrote sentences containing relative clauses. We then looked at formal and informal writing by looking at prepositions and technical language.

In topic, we continued our work on Islamic art and looked at geometric patterns. We explored different patterns and created sketches using straight lines, squares and rectangles. We then created our own geometric patterns, which we will use to lino print next week.

### **Cober Hill update -**

Costs for our residential visit to Cober Hill next January have now been finalised. More details were included in the letter sent to parents by email on 11th October. A payment request is available on the School Gateway so that parents can start making payments towards the final balance due.

## Year 6

In English we have been planning our own flashback narrative based on our text 'The Arrival'. We have explored further into the text and seen 2 more flashbacks appear. Flashback narratives tell us about the past lives of certain characters. As "The Arrival" is a picture book with no words, we have been tasked with writing the narrative to match these flashbacks. In our plans, we have been focusing on how to build suspense and tension, including the features of a flashback and planning opportunities for dialogue. We have then started writing our flashback narratives using all of the techniques we have practiced over the past few weeks. Next week we will continue with our narratives and spend some time publishing them.

In Maths, we have been understanding how to use efficient subtraction techniques by adjusting the minuend and difference to help us solve questions easily. We have struggled with this so more practice is needed but we just need to remember the STEM sentence... 'When we adjust the minued, we do the same to the difference'.

In wider curriculum this week, we have started our new geography unit based on map work skills. We have explored what an ordnance survey is and the symbols used within maps, using an eight-point compass to follow instructions and had a go at reading four and six figure grid references. We are really enjoying developing our map work skills so next week we will plan a journey using a map of Grimethorpe whilst demonstrating all of our learned skills this week.

Next week, we will also be completing our first Mock SATs quizzes. All children have been told that these are completed every half term to track the progress of their learning ready for the real SATs to take place in May 2025. We have reassured the children that we do not want them to worry about these at all, just to try their best and ask all parents to be supportive of their learning and to encourage positive attitudes.




