



Reception

We have continued our topic on "Woodland Animals" this week. We have used props to create our own woodland scenes. We have enjoyed reading the story, "Owl Babies" by Martin Waddell. We have used expression and role-play to re-enact different events from the story. We have also explored the different emotions of the characters at different points in the story.

In our Mathematics we have been exploring more and fewer. We have been comparing different amounts to see which one has more and which one has fewer. We have enjoyed playing games which involve comparing groups.

We have also been exploring how we can make the groups the same, by either adding or removing items.

We continue to learn new sounds in our daily RWInc lesson and how to blend these sounds together to make words. Please continue to use the QR codes at home to support your child's learning.

I have been very impressed with how well the children are participating in our weekly PE lesson. We have been learning how to travel in different ways around the hall and how to use space effectively.

A fabulous and very enjoyable week with our wonderful Reception children.

Year 1

Year One have had a great week. Boys and girls have done a great job at improving their letter sizing and are working hard to hold a sentence.

In Maths, we have been working on our part- part whole models and finding the missing parts of numbers.

Year One have been enjoying our Art topic about Colour and have identified lighter and darker shades of colour. We also looked at some work based on Kandinsky and recreated it ourselves.

Year 2

This week in Maths we have been working hard to compare numbers. In English we are reading "The Three Little Bears" and this week we have been thinking about appropriate adjectives to describe Goldilocks and getting better at writing our own questions. Hopefully next week will be writing our own wanted posters.

We have started learning about living things in science. We have been talking about offspring and how all animals have babies. We have talked about how sometimes those babies look like a small version of the adult animal and sometimes they look different. We have also talked about how humans grow from a baby to a toddler, teenager and adult. Next week we will be learning more about this topics in science.

Please continue to practice your spellings at home.

Year 3

This week in Whole Class Reading we have been reading poems aloud and practicing tongue twisters. We have really enjoyed them!

In English, we have started a new book called "Sparky" about a girl who gets a pet sloth. We have practiced writing sentences including conjunctions all about sloths.

In Maths, we have been learning how to add and subtract ten from any two-digit number. We have used our number squares to 200 to help us with this. We then moved onto adding and subtracting other multiples of ten from two-digit numbers.

In science, we have been investigating magnetic materials and in French we have continued to work on numbers up to 10.

In P.E., we have practiced our gymnastics sequences, including our symmetrical and asymmetrical balances.

In art this week, we have used the pointillism technique to create a light and dark shading effect and in geography we have located Cornwall on a UK map and we have identified its physical and human features.

Please could we remind parents to ensure that children have their P.E. kits in school every Wednesday and Friday (please also include outdoor trainers). We also kindly ask that long hair is tied back and any jewelry is removed ready for our lessons.

We also just wanted to remind you about TT Rockstars and Spelling Shed. These can be accessed at home and are there to support and engage your child with their times tables and spellings.

Year 4

Another interesting week in year 4 where we have been planning and writing our independent explanations. Next week we will complete these polished pieces before moving onto narrative writing about the text "Iron Man". In Maths we have been looking at different scales labelling them from 0 to 1000 and 0 to 2000. Next week we will be moving onto partitioning 4 digit numbers in different ways.

In the wider curriculum we have been learning about major inventions in the Victorian Era. In PD we have looked at Enterprise and in RE we have continued to look at Sikh Holy days.

Well done for your enthusiasm in times tables. It is great to see the children practicing at home and school. Next week will see our first soundcheck which will allow me to gauge which questions children need to work on and I will be sending out updated heat maps to show progress from the start of September.

Year 5

In Maths this week, we continued our work on decimal fractions and extended our learning to include hundredths. We began by identifying hundredths as part of a whole and then described and represented hundredths as a decimal fraction. Next, we described and wrote decimal numbers with hundredths in different ways and then compared and ordered them.

In English, we published our proposals to NASA and enjoyed sharing them with the class. We then looked at the key features of an expanded explanation, in preparation for writing our own. Next week, we will look at formal and informal writing and begin to design our rovers.

In topic, we continued our work on Islamic Art. We studied the artist William De Morgan and found out that he was inspired by Islamic art. He included floral designs, using vivid colours and intricate repeating patterns. We studied his artwork and compared this to examples of Islamic architecture. We then created a simple sketch of one of his famous tile designs and will create repeating patterns next week.

Year 6

This week in Maths, we have been solving problems using equivalence and compensation strategies. We found this fun and challenging as we were solving magic squares where each column, row and diagonal equaled the same amount. We have now moved onto representing constant difference when subtracting. We know to make written calculations more efficient by using constant difference and changing one of the numbers into a multiple of ten. We have worked really well when doing this. Next week we will continue looking at strategies to help us solve subtraction questions.

In English, we have been planning and practicing writing a flashback narrative based on the girls escape from our text 'The arrival'. We have broken this down into steps to make sure we have used effective description and vocabulary to build an image in the reader's mind. We have needed to make sure we include all of our planned grammar skills that we have been practicing from last week. Next week, we will edit and improve these stories then work on planning our own flashback narrative based on a choice of our own.

For wider curriculum, we have been continuing with our art unit based on Landscapes. On Tuesday, we completed our first attempt at a one-point perspective landscape. Mrs Bradbury was very impressed with these and how we had used the guidelines to help us. On Wednesday, we explored the artwork by Salvador Dali and found out what surrealism is. On Thursday, we then combined surrealism and our landscape work together to create our own surrealist landscapes. We really enjoyed being creative and drawing strange objects in a landscape scene!

In PE, we have been practicing volleyball skills to prepare us for an upcoming competition. We have also been perfecting our dance routines to the Greatest Showman song. Our dances now have unison, a canon, freeze frames and a mirror movement included in them. We have been working well in teams to share ideas.


