Reception

This week we have been reading the story "Halibut Jackson" by David Lucas. This is about a little boy who is shy and likes to blend in. He then discovers the joys of being brave and different. We have spoken about the feelings and emotions of the character at different points in the story. We have then spoken about occasions when we have felt shy, happy, excited and brave. I have been really impressed by the growing vocabulary the children are using and how well they are engaging our story time sessions.

In our Mathematics we have been exploring early composition. We have been using a range of resources to explore how numbers are made up. We have been learning how to use a range of mathematical vocabulary correctly i.e add, move, altogether, makes, equals, same as etc.

In our curriculum sessions we have continued to explore how we have grown and changed. The children have really enjoyed sharing their photographs and have used these to create their own time lines.

We have been talking about all the new things we can do now we are at school.


Next week we will be exploring where we live and will start to discuss changes we can see how Autumn is here.

Year 1

This week Year One have been learning what a whole is in Maths. The children have done really well at grouping objects that make a whole and identifying what isn't a whole.

In English, we started a new text 'Cave Baby'. Cave Baby draws lots of cave animals on the cave walk and is so happy when painting. The children have been writing sentences about the different cave animals.

In RE, the children have been exploring special places of worship for Christians and Muslims. Year One were really engaged and loved finding out what is inside a Mosque.

All children must come with their book bag to school. We do listen to the children read and encourage them to access their Read Write Inc books when reading as they match their reading ability.

Year 2

Lots of writing progress this week in year 2!

The children have been writing post cards to aunt Lucy from Paddington bear. They are trying so hard with their letter formation and working on using full stops, capitals and question marks.

In Maths we have been counting forwards and backwards beyond 100. Then moving on to counting larger groups of objects counting the tens first and then the extra ones. Next week in Maths we will be using a number line to position and estimate numbers 20-99.

In Art we have been designing our own collages using paper and making our own stain-glass windows. Look out for them in our classroom window next week.

We will now be using Spelling Shed to help us learn new spelling rules, new spellings will continue to be sent home on Wednesdays. Please support your child by learning these at home. I have also sent a QR code for your child to access their own Spelling Shed account where they find games to help them learn new spelling rules.

Year 3

This week we have continued reading "Arthur and the Golden Rope" in whole class reading. We have practiced scanning the text to find information and we have written a book review too.

In English, we have been using coordinating conjunctions in our writing and we have practiced how to use commas in a list too, making sure we don't overuse 'and' in our writing.

In Maths, we have been looking at three-digit numbers and how to represent them correctly. We have used Maths equipment to help us make the numbers and we have also moved onto writing addition and subtraction equations using our knowledge of place value to help us.

In science we have looked at the north and south poles on magnets and how they can attract or repel. We are really enjoying our current science topic and we love exploring the magnets!

In P.E. we have continued working on symmetrical balances in gymnastics and practicing our passing and shooting skills in handball.

In art this week we have used different tools to create some pointillism art in the style of George Seurat and in geography we have looked at the different counties in the UK and we even managed to find South Yorkshire on our maps!

Year 4

This week in year 4 we have been looking at subtraction in Maths exchanging from both the tens and the hundreds. Next week we will move onto place value looking up at how we can split amounts.

In English we have planned and began to read a shared explanation with independent sections before we complete our own fully independent writing piece.

In History we have looked at Queen Victoria and the impact she made on the world and some of the key inventions from the time.

In PE we did some 3 on 2s to work on passing and moving the balls. Next week we will start our tag rugby sessions.

In reading we have finished the "zombierella unit" and used the time to read about Queen Victoria from different sources.

Next week is Macmillan Coffee morning and the children are excited to see you all dressed as mad hatters!

Year 5

In Maths, we explained that decimal numbers with tenths can be composed additively and multiplicatively. We looked how tenths are used in different contexts and used part-part whole models to write addition and subtraction equations. We then used our knowledge to calculate with decimal numbers using mental methods, as well as column addition and subtraction. Next week, we will round decimal numbers with tenths to the nearest whole number.

In English, we worked together to plan a proposal to NASA about a new Mars rover. We then completed a guided write together, ensuring to include key vocabulary, sophisticated conjunctions and modal verbs. Next week, we will plan and write our own proposals using a rover, which will be sent to Mars to do a specific task.

In Geography, we found out about trade and industry in South America. We discussed what trade means in terms of geography and looked at some of the products that countries in South America produce and export to other countries. Next week, we will compare an area of South America with the UK.

Year 6

This week in English we have been publishing our informal letters up in neat. Further into the week we have started exploring what a flashback narrative is. We looked at an example of a good one and found the features so we know exactly what makes a good flashback narrative. We have now started to practice and learn some of the grammar skills to be able to write a good one ourselves. On Friday we looked at practicing using expanded noun phrases and ways to use vivid vocabulary and descriptive language. Next week, we will explore and learn more grammar skills and eventually have a go at writing a flashback narrative as a practice.

In Maths, we have been using redistribution with addition of integers and decimal fractions. This is a way to help us solve calculations quicker and mentally. Mrs Bradbury has been really impressed with us! We then started to look at balanced equations to calculate redistribution which was a little trickier so next week we will continue with this learning.

In History, we have been using a range of evidence sources to help us understand more about the Maya civilisation and exploring what the Maya writing consists of, how words are constructed and what codices are. Next week, we will be moving onto our Art unit looking at landscapes.
