Attendance

Our attendance target is 96%. Each week the class with the highest attendance receives an award and £5 credit towards an end of year treat. Last week, **Y3** achieved the highest attendance of 99.7%. **WELL DONE!**

Lates

Polite reminder that if your child/ren arrive between 8.55am and 9.15am they will receive a late mark (L) code. If your child/ren arrive after 9.15am they will receive a (U) code which is also an unauthorised late mark and could lead to a fixed penalty. Absences, whether authorised or unauthorised will bring your child/ren's attendance down.

Illnesses

It can be tricky deciding whether or not to keep your child off school, nursery or playgroup when they're unwell. Please see illnesses information below.

Polite reminder that if your child/ren are unwell, please ensure contact is made to the office, via the app or leaving a voicemail on 01226 711488. Please ensure a reason for absence is provided daily.

Appointments in school time

Polite reminder that medical/dental appointments need to be arranged outside of school hours, on occasions this may be unavoidable, please always ensure appointment confirmation cards/letters are provided to the school office at the earliest opportunity so these can be added to your child/ren's record.

Home visits

Home visits will be carried out to check on the well-being of children who are absent from school. These visits will take place in cases where no contact can be made to establish reason for absence and on day 3 of absence in all cases, and will continue if absence persists. In some cases, dependent on the circumstances surrounding pupil absence, we may make a home visit sooner. If deemed appropriate, the Education Welfare Officer may make the home visit.

Leave of Absences

Penalty Notices are requested from schools and **issued by the Local Authority** to the parents/carers of statutory school age children, and can be issued per parent, per child. For example: 3 siblings absent for leave of absence in term time could result in **each** parent/ carer receiving 3 separate fines at the below rates.

- **First offence** - The first time a Penalty Notice is issued the amount will be: £80 per parent, per child paid within 21 days. This fine increases to £160 per parent, per child if paid after day 21, until day 28.
- **Second Offence (within 3 years)** - the second time a Penalty Notice is issued the amount will be £160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days.
- **Third Offence and Any Further Offences (within 3 years)** - the third time an offence is committed a Penalty Notice will not be issued, and the case may be presented straight to the Magistrates' Court under s.444 of the Education Act (1996) or other legal interventions considered. The Magistrates' Court can order fines up to £2500 per parent, per child.

Failure to pay a Penalty Notice will render you liable to criminal proceedings in the Magistrates Court under Section 444 of the Education Act 1996.

Nursery

This week, we have been reading the story of 'The Gruffalo' and have been talking about the different characters in the story. We tried to paint pictures of the Gruffalo by looking at his features. In Maths, we looked at quantity language of 'more' and 'less' to describe amounts.

Next week, we will be carrying on with our topic of 'Woodland animals'. We will also be looking at how we keep safe with people around us by learning about 'Stranger Danger' and talking about how we keep ourselves safe.

We are currently changing the pictures around in our Reading Area. We have a section where we put pictures of us reading at home. Reception

This week we have continued to find out lots of interesting facts about woodland animals. We are learning how to use non-fiction books to acquire new information. We have been learning lots of new vocabulary in our whole class sessions.

We have also been learning how to observe carefully in our art sessions and to add increasing detail to our own pictures.

In our mathematics we have been learning how to form numbers correctly. We have also been naming and recognising 2D shapes. We have been noticing shapes all around us and have been talking about the properties of shapes. We have used 2D shapes to create our own pictures and repeating patterns.

In our RWInc lesson we are continuing to learn our sounds and to write these correctly, we are also learning how to blend sounds together to make words.

I am really impressed by how hard the children are working each day and also the practise which is taking place at home. An enormous thank you for supporting the learning at home. Daily reading and practice at home and school has a huge impact on progress and achievement.

Next week we will be finding out about Autumn and the changes we see all around us. We will be reading "The Gruffalo" in our literacy sessions and in mathematics we will be exploring early composition.

Picture of the week



Year 1

Year One have had a great week. Boys and girls have done a great job with their writing and are working hard on forming their letters correctly and using their perfect sitting positions.

In Maths, we have been exploring bar models and learning what the word 'combine' means. The children have also been comparing numbers and sets of objects.

Year One have been enjoying our History topic and have spent time comparing old and new toys. We have read lots of stories about toys too!

This week we learned some fun facts about the Harvest Moon as we noticed that the moon had been so bright! Boys and girls also enjoyed seeing some autumnal crafts brought in by children which is lovely to see.

Year 2

This week we have been learning even more about coal mining! We have learned that there were lots of tools used down the mines to release the coal including dynamite, drill cutters and disk cutters. We have used this information to build sentences and practiced the spelling and punctuation needed to make our sentences better. This is a gradual build up of skills that will help us to write more detailed sentences in the future ready for our big write pieces.

In maths we have now been applying our place value skills to more complex questions such as placing numbers on number lines, addition and subtraction and comparing two numbers using, greater than, less than, and equal to.

We have begun to put all our knowledge together about Henri Rousseau to recreate a picture of where the old mining site used to be in Grimethorpe.

We have also looked at portrait and landscape pictures in computing and are becoming amazing at handball in PE.

Next week we will be looking at joining our simple sentences together with conjunctions and adding shading to our artwork to create silhouettes of the old Grimethorpe mine to add to our pictures, we will continue our work on place value to tackle more complex reasoning and problem solving and word problems in maths.

Year 3

We have really enjoyed our Whole Class reading sessions this week as we have practised and performed a range of poetry, using expression and intonation in our voices when we read.

In English, we have been writing our own fantasy stories based on our class book "Leon and the place in Between". We have used conjunctions and expanded noun phrases to improve our work.

In maths, we have moved onto measurement and we have focused on measuring items using centimetres and metres. We have spoken about measuring items accurately and carefully to ensure we get the correct measurement.

We have looked at the physical and human features of Cornwall in Geography and we have enjoyed creating our very own pointillist art work in art. In R.E., we have looked at the Hindu religion and the symbols associated with it.

In science, we have found out which materials and magnets are magnetic. In French, we continued to practise how to count to 10 and in PD we voted for our school councillors.

In P.E. we have focused on hand ball and gymnastics, improving our skills in both of these units.
Please ensure your child has their P.E. kit in school every Thursday and Friday and that jewellery is removed before the children come to school on these days.

Year 4

This week we have completed our first official practise of the multiplication check and i can see lots of progression from the start of term however, it is still really important that children are practising their timetables at home and TT Rockstars is a fantastic tool for this. In maths this week we have been looking at reading scales and converting between ml to l and m to km by

multiplying and dividing by 1000. We have also been looking at the missing numbers on different scales including counting in 100, 200, 250 and 500. Next week we will move onto rounding.

In English we have been looking at features of a diary and looking at fronted adverbials. Next week we will write some diaries from different characters at different points in our stories.

In the wider curriculum we have looked at the education system in Victorian times and also the new Queen Victoria's inventions during reign. In science we have been looking at condensation. In RE we have continued to look at the Holy Bible and some parables.

Year 5

This week in Maths, we have continued our work on adding and subtracting decimal numbers up to 1 decimal place. After solving problems using decimal numbers, we used different representations to round decimals with tenths to the nearest whole number. Next week, we will begin to identify hundredths as part of a whole and represent hundredths in different ways.

In English, we continued to write a proposal together and worked with partners to edit and improve our writing. We tried to include all of the key features discussed so far and changed some of our vocabulary to make our writing sound more formal. Next week, we will write our own proposals and decide what our rover's main job will be.

In Whole Class Read, we explored an extract called 'Orbiting the Sun'. We identified the key vocabulary and used this to discuss questions relating to the Sun's radiation and importance of the Sun to the Earth. We used a range of sentence stems to articulate our answers and gave opinions and ideas using evidence from the text.

This week in Art, we designed arabesque patterns and began adding these to lino tiles. We will continue this next week and use different printing techniques to create our own Islamic style pieces. We will also look at how the Islamic world inspired non-Islamic artists around the world, by studying the artist William De Morgan.

Year 6

Year 6 have had another busy and creative week full of learning, discussion, and imagination!

In Maths, we've been exploring the concept of *constant difference* and learning how it can help us solve subtraction problems and balance equations efficiently. Later in the week, we turned our attention to large numbers, confidently recognising and working with numbers up to one million – and even up to ten million!

In English, we've continued developing our writing skills through our "*Eye of the Storm*" narrative work. The children practised using parenthesis, colons, and semi-colons to add rich detail and variety to their writing, as well as experimenting with hyphenated adjectives and relative clauses to bring their characters and settings to life. Towards the end of the week, we consolidated our understanding of verb tenses, focusing on present and past tense through practical grammar tasks.

This week in topic, we have moved onto Art which has been particularly exciting as we have been studying *African ceremonial masks*. The children explored their spiritual significance, analysed different traditional designs, and began creating their own mask designs using geometric and symmetrical patterns. They also planned how to build their masks as layered relief sculptures — a fantastic combination of creativity and cultural understanding!

In Personal Development, we discussed financial responsibility, learning about key terms such as *invest*, *loan*, and *debt*, and why looking after money is such an important life skill.

In RE, we explored how churches support and serve their communities, looking at real-life case studies to understand the positive impact they have on people's lives.

We also enjoyed PE, continuing with our *Tag Rugby* unit, and had time for Music and French, rounding off the week with lots of energy and enthusiasm.

It's been a fantastic week of progress, creativity, and teamwork – well done, Year 6! Have a lovely weekend!
