Attendance

Lates

Polite reminder that if your child/ren arrive between 8.55am and 9.15am they will receive a late mark (L) code. If your child/ren arrive after 9.15am they will receive a (U) code which is also an unauthorised late mark and could lead to a fixed penalty. Absences, whether authorised or unauthorised will bring your child/ren's attendance down.

Illnesses

It can be tricky deciding whether or not to keep your child off school, nursery or playgroup when they're unwell. Please see illnesses information below.

Polite reminder that if your child/ren are unwell, please ensure contact is made to the office, via the app or leaving a voicemail on 01226 711488. Please ensure a reason for absence is provided daily.

Appointments in school time

Polite reminder that medical/dental appointments need to be arranged outside of school hours, on occasions this may be unavoidable, please always ensure appointment confirmation cards/letters are provided to the school office at the earliest opportunity so these can be added to your child/ren's record.

Home visits

Home visits will be carried out to check on the well-being of children who are absent from school. These visits will take place in cases where no contact can be made to establish reason for absence and on day 3 of absence in all cases, and will continue if absence persists. In some


cases, dependent on the circumstances surrounding pupil absence, we may make a home visit sooner. If deemed appropriate, the Education Welfare Officer may make the home visit.


Leave of Absences

Penalty Notices are requested from schools and **issued by the Local Authority** to the parents/carers of statutory school age children, and can be issued per parent, per child. For example: 3 siblings absent for leave of absence in term time could result in **each** parent/ carer receiving 3 separate fines at the below rates.

- **First offence** - The first time a Penalty Notice is issued the amount will be: £80 per parent, per child paid within 21 days. This fine increases to £160 per parent, per child if paid after day 21, until day 28.
- **Second Offence (within 3 years)** - the second time a Penalty Notice is issued the amount will be £160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days.
- **Third Offence and Any Further Offences (within 3 years)** - the third time an offence is committed a Penalty Notice will not be issued, and the case may be presented straight to the Magistrates' Court under s.444 of the Education Act (1996) or other legal interventions considered. The Magistrates' Court can order fines up to £2500 per parent, per child.

Failure to pay a Penalty Notice will render you liable to criminal proceedings in the Magistrates Court under Section 444 of the Education Act 1996.

Nursery

This week in Nursery, we have been talking about the celebration of Christmas and how we celebrate Christmas. In Maths, we have been talking about positional language and trying to use words to describe our positions. We have also been creating our Christmas cards and calendars which will be going home over the next few days.

Next week, we will be discussing the Nativity story and the events that happen in the story. In Maths, we will continue to look at positional language and describe where things are.

Reception

This week we have been busy preparing for our Nativity play. We have been singing our songs, rehearsing our lines and enjoyed trying on our costumes. We have been reading the Nativity story and have drawn our own pictures to show different scenes and events.

In our mathematics we have been looking at patterns and the patterns that we can see all around us. We have been focussing on repeating patterns and have used lots of different resources to create our own patterns. We have also been revising the number bonds that we know up to 5. We have been identifying the pairs of numbers that make 3, 4 and 5. We are learning how to write our own number sentences to show our calculations.

In our curriculum lessons we have been exploring how Christmas is celebrated. We have spoken about how we prepare for Christmas and how we plan to celebrate with family and friends.

Next week we are looking forward to performing our Nativity play. We are looking forward to our festive lunch, we are also excited about our Christmas party on Friday. Children can come to school in their party clothes on this day. Can we please ask for sensible footwear to be worn as we will be playing outdoors as usual.

Year 1

We've had a wonderful and festive week of learning in Year 1! Here's a look at what we've been up to:

This week, the children enjoyed reading "*One Snowy Night*". We explored the characters, setting, and events in the story, and the children practised retelling the story. They particularly enjoyed using story maps and actions to help them remember the sequence. Ask your child to retell the story at home—you might hear some brilliant storytelling!

In Science, we learned how to name and group different animals. The children explored categories such as mammals, birds, reptiles, amphibians, and fish. They loved sorting pictures and discussing what makes each group unique.

Festivity has arrived in Year 1! The children have been creating their Christmas cards. They worked carefully and creatively, and we can't wait for you to see their beautiful designs.

In RE, we focused on the Nativity story. The children learned simple actions to help them remember the key events—from the angel visiting Mary to the journey to Bethlehem and the birth of Jesus. They have really enjoyed acting out the story together.

Polite reminder to bring in top/bottom clothing for underneath the children's costumes for next week's Christmas play. We have been busy sorting out the costumes we have in school and had our first dress rehearsal this week. If your child is a singer, they will need a Christmas jumper.

What an incredible week we've had in Year 2! The children have continued to make excellent progress across all areas of their learning, and we are so proud of the enthusiasm and determination they show every single day.

In English, we have been focusing on contractions and prefixes and suffixes. The children have worked hard to understand how these word parts can change meaning and help us write more clearly and creatively. This learning will be extremely useful as we begin preparing our next Big Write pieces next week. The confidence and independence the children are showing in their writing is wonderful to see.

In Maths, the class has made fantastic progress adding three addends. We have been using tens frames and number lines to help us visualise the numbers, and we are now able to solve word problems linked to number stories using three addends too. The children have shown brilliant resilience and reasoning skills—well done Year 2!

Our Christmas Concert is now almost ready for the big performance next week. The children have been practising with great energy and excitement, and we are very much looking forward to our full dress rehearsals. You are in for a real treat!

This week, we also began our mindfulness journaling. The children have enjoyed taking time to reflect on how wonderful, kind, and resilient they are. Journaling is helping us organise our thoughts so we can focus even better on our learning. Alongside this, we have started listening to daily affirmations to help us speak positively about ourselves and build confidence.

Next week is our much-anticipated Christmas Fun Week! We have parties, Christmas lunches, and of course "The Big Show". We cannot wait to share all our hard work with the people we love.

Year 3

This week in literacy, we have read the story 'Coming Home' by Michael Morpurgo and we have started to use expanded noun phrases to describe what the robin sees on his journey.

We are continuing to read our book- 'The Lion and the Unicorn' in Whole Class Reading and we have learnt some excellent vocabulary linked to our WW2 topic.

In maths, we have been using known number facts to help us to partition numbers when we are solving problems. We have finished our topic on World War 2 and we discussed when the war ended and the effect it had on people.

In French, we have learned the months of the year and in science we have learned about muscles and how they help us to move. We have done dodgeball in our P.E. lessons this week and we have made Christmas cards in our art lesson too. We have also practised our performance including our Christmas songs in music.

Year 4

This week in year 4 we have written a character description of the "Iron Man" before he fell off the cliff and broke apart after finding part of his body in the playground. We have also looked at locating fronted adverbials and expanded noun phrases in a good example. We have also looked at what usually happens in a story with a build up, a problem happening and solving the problem at the end of the story through a resolution. Next week we will attempt to re write each part of the Iron Man story.

In maths this week we have looked at the 3 times table and began to look at the correlation between 3's and 6's. This will continue next week as well as adding the 9's and 12's with this looking at how each of the times tables relate to each other.

Elsewhere we have been practising for our concerts which take place next week on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday.

Next week in the wider curriculum we will be making our calendars and cards which can be taken home at the end of the week. We will also have Christmas dinner and our party next week (Friday) where children can come in party clothes and will have some nibbles and some dances.

Year 5

We've had a very busy and festive week in class! The children have enjoyed making their Christmas calendars and have been working hard rehearsing for our Christmas performance – enthusiasm is definitely building.

In English, we completed a shared write about a rover named *Pilgrim*, ensuring we included all the key features of an expanded explanation text.

In Maths, the children completed some assessments and continued our work on money, learning how to explain and represent whole pounds and pence as quantities, as well as comparing different amounts of money.

Next week, we will continue to find out more about the Vikings.

Year 6

Year 6 have worked incredibly hard this week as they completed several SATs practice papers in reading, SPaG and maths. Their focus, resilience and positive attitudes were fantastic to see.

In English, the children practised using cohesive devices and took part in a shared write, modelling how to write the opening of a letter. In Maths, they worked on subtracting powers of 10, recognising number patterns, estimating on number lines and solving problems using column addition and subtraction.

We also continued our Christmas concert rehearsals, and the children are sounding wonderful as they prepare for their performance.

The week ended with Music, French, and PE, rounding off a productive and festive week of learning!
