Attendance

Our attendance target is 96%. Each week the class with the highest attendance receives an award and £5 credit towards an end of year treat. On the last week of term, **Y2** achieved the highest attendance of 98.2%. **WELL DONE!**

Lates

Polite reminder that if your child/ren arrive between 8.55am and 9.15am they will receive a late mark (L) code. If your child/ren arrive after 9.15am they will receive a (U) code which is also an unauthorised late mark and could lead to a fixed penalty. Absences, whether authorised or unauthorised will bring your child/ren's attendance down.

Appointments in school time

Polite reminder that medical/dental appointments need to be arranged outside of school hours, on occasions this may be unavoidable, please always ensure appointment confirmation cards/letters are provided to the school office at the earliest opportunity so these can be added to your child/ren's record.

Home visits



Home visits will be carried out to check on the well-being of children who are absent from school. These visits will take place in cases where no contact can be made to establish reason for absence and on day 3 of absence in all cases, and will continue if absence persists. In some cases, dependent on the circumstances surrounding pupil absence, we may make a home visit sooner. If deemed appropriate, the Education Welfare Officer may make the home visit.

Leave of Absences

Penalty Notices are requested from schools and **issued by the Local Authority** to the parents/carers of statutory school age children, and can be issued per parent, per child. For example: 3 siblings absent for leave of absence in term time could result in **each** parent/ carer receiving 3 separate fines at the below rates.

- **First offence** - The first time a Penalty Notice is issued the amount will be: £80 per parent, per child paid within 21 days. This fine increases to £160 per parent, per child if paid after day 21, until day 28.
- **Second Offence (within 3 years)** - the second time a Penalty Notice is issued the amount will be £160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days.
- **Third Offence and Any Further Offences (within 3 years)** - the third time an offence is committed a Penalty Notice will not be issued, and the case may be presented straight to the Magistrates' Court under s.444 of the Education Act (1996) or other legal interventions considered. The Magistrates' Court can order fines up to £2500 per parent, per child.


Failure to pay a Penalty Notice will render you liable to criminal proceedings in the Magistrates Court under Section 444 of the Education Act 1996.

Nursery

This week in Nursery, we have been reading the story of 'The Little Red Hen'. We have been comparing the different versions of the story. We have also been looking at what happens when we add wet objects to dry objects. In Maths, we have been using the language of quantity.

Next week, we will be reading the story of 'Jack and the Beanstalk'. We will be looking at how plants grow and what they need to grown. In Maths, we will be looking at height and using different language to compare objects.

Class Photographs

Children who attend **afternoon nursery** are also expected to attend at this time also and we kindly ask that parents/carers stay with their children until the photograph has been taken then return their children in the afternoon.

Reception

This week we have been reading "Goldilocks and the Three Bears" as part of our topic on "traditional tales". We have spoken about the actions of the different characters at the beginning, middle and end of the story. We have been practising our comprehension skills by sequencing events and answering a range of questions.

In our literacy sessions we have been reading "Hairy McClary from Donaldson's Dairy" by Lynley Dodd. We have been thinking of our own words to describe the different dogs in the story.

We have applied our phonics skills when sounding out own words for the labels to accompany our pictures.


In Mathematics we have been working on our Number Bonds to 8. We have identified the pairs of numbers that make 8. We have also been naming and identifying 3D shapes. We have spotted shapes around us and have used 3D shapes to create our own models and structures.

As the weather is getting warmer we have spoken about sun safety. We have discussed the range of things that we can do to protect ourselves and the things we need to do to try and keep cool.

Picture of the week



Year 1

In Year 1 this week, children have started to learn about the value of money by recognising coins and understanding that each coin has a different value. They have practised counting coins, starting with the same type and then combining different coins to make small amount. It was tricky to start with but the children started linking their skip counting to help them find the total value!

In English, we continued our book; "*Lost and Found*" by Oliver Jeffers, a boy finds a sad penguin and tries to help him get home. When giving advice to the penguin, children wrote about being kind and thoughtful, staying close to someone who cares and asking for help when feeling lonely.

The children have been excitedly watching their runner bean plants grow all week! We will keep observing them and send the plants home next week.

A polite reminder that next Wednesday 21st May will be class photo day.

Year 2

This week in English, we have completed our big write pieces about the "Big Bad Wolf" using descriptive language and alternative sentence openers. We really enjoy publishing our pieces as it makes us feel like real authors. We have looked carefully at expanded noun phrases for description and have made sure that we include them in our work. Next week we will practice new skills including prepositions and prepositional phrases and verbs to help us gather skills that we will need for our next big write.

In Maths, we continued on the times tables by exploring patterns within the 0s, 1s and 2 times tables so that we know that when multiplying by 0 the answer will always be zero, when multiplying by 1 the answer will be the same as one of the factors e.g. 1×1 will be 1 and 2×1 will be 2 next week, we will continue to explore these patterns and see how they can be applied to trickier Maths problems.

In Computing, we used planning sheets to use all the knowledge and skills we have learned over our programming quizzes unit such as changing backgrounds, choosing new sprites and

choosing what our sprites say, to create our own quizzes. Next week we will be using the finished plans to create the quizzes and share them with our friends.

In history we explored the life of Florence Nightingale in further detail and talked about and created posters linking to the advancements in medical care that have taken place thanks to her efforts. We were lucky to study this on actual National Nurses Day which is Florence Nightingales birthday.

Year 3

In English we have continued to read our "Earthshattering Events" text. We have practised using apostrophes when writing about earthquakes and we have written an information text, including key vocabulary that we have learned.

In maths, we have moved on to column subtraction with two and three-digit numbers. We have practised how to exchange and borrow numbers when needed too.

In science we have learned about how we can ensure that we have a balanced diet. We also designed meals for vegetarians and for people who are lactose intolerant.

In art we have focused on line and we have used a range of lines to help us to create different sketches and in music we played the glockenspiels and practised our class song for this half term.

In geography, we have learned about how and why volcanoes erupt and in Personal Development we learned about germs and how we can wash our hands to prevent viruses spreading.

In P.E. children have continued to practise their cricket skills. Please ensure that P.E. kits are brought in every Thursday and that jewellery has been removed at home before the lesson.

Year 4

In English, we wrote character descriptions about Howard Carter and begun looking at compound adjectives. We will be writing our own diary entries using these. In reading we have continued reading the humans with a focus on the Aborigines and the Sumerians. Next week we will be looking closely at synonyms and learning about Ancient China.

In Maths, we have been solving problems using mixed numbers and starting looking at number lines. Next week we will continue this and order mixed numbers using different number lines.

In Art, we have planned our animal sculptures and explored which junk materials would be best for each component. Once we have collected enough recycled materials, we will be making these. In RE, we have learnt about why Buddhists give offering during "Vesak" and have been investigating Rivers around the world in Geography.

Year 5

This week in English, we have continued writing our short science-fiction stories by following our bare bones planning. We have looked carefully at dialogue and ensured that we include the correct speech punctuation and detail to our reporting clauses. We will continue to write these next week and hopefully begin publishing them.

In Maths, we continued our work on division by using short division with exchanging and remainders. We solved problems by using the most efficient strategies including mental,

partitioning and the short-written method. Next week, we will look at calculating with decimal fractions.

In Computing, we created story boards to plan our videos. We considered a range of filming techniques and outlined the scenes of our videos. Next, we created our videos and saved the content. We then reviewed and evaluated them in our groups and suggested improvements, focussing on filming techniques and sound quality. Next week, we will start a new Design and Technology topic on bridges.

Year 6

This week has been SATs week and I cannot stress how well the children have applied themselves this week. We have worked really hard and hopefully the results will show how well we have tried. In the afternoons, we have been looking forward to the next assessments and had some games of rounders and other PE games.

Well done Year 6 and enjoy a restful weekend!
